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NEVADA STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

ACTIVITIES REPORT

JANUARY 10-11, 2018 BOARD MEETING HELD IN LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

This report is prepared and presented to keep interested legislators and others abreast of the activities of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy. Following is a summary of the January 2018 Board meeting.

Licensing Activity:

- 7 licenses were granted for Out-of-State MDEG (Medical Devices, Equipment and Gases) companies and 1 granted for a Nevada MDEG company.
- 16 licenses were granted for Out-of-State pharmacies; pending receipt of a favorable inspection for all compounding pharmacies, and 1 license issued for a Canadian pharmacy.
- 15 licenses were granted for Out-of-State wholesalers.
- 8 licenses were granted for Nevada pharmacies.
- 2 licenses were renewed and 1 tabled for pharmacists with disciplinary issues in other states.
- 1 license was tabled for a pharmacy tech in training to gather more information on past use of a controlled substance.

Disciplinary Actions:

- Pharmacists HC and AD were ordered letters of reprimand and 4 additional hours of CE for filling a Protonix prescription with propranolol, resulting in alleged patient harm. AD was fined \$2700 as was pharmacy CV, which was also ordered to develop a training module on deletion of prescriptions.
- Pharmacists DR, MG, and EB disciplined for deleting a prescription after misfilling it with vials rather than capsules. DR was suspended (suspension then stayed); fined \$3K and put on probation for 3 months. MG and EB were each fined and ordered letters of reprimand.
- Pharmacist MT was ordered a letter of reprimand; 4 extra hours of CE; and fined \$2750 for filling an Adderal prescription with the wrong strength. Pharmacy CV was fined an administrative fee of \$1500.
- Pharmacys PR and SR were ordered to bring their pharmacies into compliance with Nevada law, after remodeling with permission or inspection.

Other Activity:

- The usual Board business reports were given, including recent and future speaking engagements; reports on national meetings; and collaboration with other state agencies.
- The annual audit of the Board of Pharmacy by an outside agency was accepted.

Workshop:

A. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 639.742: Dispensing of controlled substances or dangerous drugs. The proposed amendments to NAC 639.742 Add a new section thereto relating to the dispensing of controlled substances and dangerous drugs by practitioners of veterinary medicine.

- B. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 639 to add a new section thereto relating to the issuance of an order to show cause for failure to comply with an order entered by the Board. To provide for the issuance by the Executive Secretary of an order to show cause for failure to comply with the terms of an order directing the respondent to appear before the Board at the next regularly-scheduled meeting for a show cause hearing.
- C. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 639 to add a new section thereto relating to practitioner access to the database of the program established pursuant to NRS 453.162. To require practitioners to register with the Board to access the database. To allow a practitioner to designate members of his or her staff to act as delegates for the purposes of accessing the database. To provide for the suspension or termination of access to the database if the Board or the Division has probable cause to believe that the database has been intentionally accessed by a person or for a purpose not authorized by law.

Public Hearing:

A. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 453.460: The proposed amendment to NAC 453.460 revises provisions relating to the partial filling of a controlled substance listed in Schedule II. (LCB File No. R007-17)

This regulation revises the circumstances in which a pharmacist is authorized to partially fill a prescription for a controlled substance listed in schedule II. The regulation requires that the remaining portion of a partially filled schedule II prescription must be filled not later than 30 days after the date the prescription was written; the remaining portion of an emergency schedule II prescription must be filled not later than 72 hours after the prescription was issued; requires a pharmacist to refuse to fill or partially fill a schedule II prescription more than 30 days after the date the prescription was written.
