## Learning Objectives

Nevada Pharmacy Law (0.1 CEU)

1. Apply pharmacy laws regarding expiration date labeling requirements for prescriptions dispensed in the community setting.
2. Identify situations in which information in a schedule II prescription cannot legally be changed.
3. Recognize situations which meet legal requirements for patient counseling in Nevada.
4. Recognize proper procedures for reporting personnel and training records with the Board of Pharmacy.
5. Apply proper procedures for handling electronic prescriptions.
6. Recognize proper procedures for the storage and monitoring of refrigerated prescription products with emphasis on proper settings.
7. Identify those who need to comply with USP 795 and USP 797 standards in their pharmacy operations.

**Target audience:** Pharmacists and technicians practicing in Nevada who wish to meet their law-specific CE requirements. The activity will primarily focus on community pharmacy practice.
