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NEVADA STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

ACTIVITIES REPORT

APRIL 13-14, 2016 BOARD MEETING HELD IN LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

This report is prepared and presented to keep interested legislators and others abreast of the activities of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy. Following is a summary of the April, 2016 Board meeting.

Licensing Activity:

- 4 licenses were granted for Out-of-State MDEG (Medical Devices, Equipment and Gases) companies.
- 2 licenses were granted for Nevada MDEG companies.
- 29 licenses were granted for Out-of-State pharmacies, pending receipt of a favorable inspection for all compounding pharmacies.
- 19 licenses were granted for Out-of-State wholesalers, one pending staff inspection.
- 5 licenses were granted for Nevada pharmacies.
- 4 licenses were granted for pharmacists pending provision of further information.
- 1 pharmacist license to reciprocate to Nevada was approved pending a positive evaluation by PRN-PRN.
- 2 licenses were granted and 1 denied for pharmacy technicians (the denied one for substance abuse).

Disciplinary Actions:

- Pharmaceutical technician KK was revoked for diversion of controlled substances and dangerous drugs for personal use from a pharmacy.
- Pharmacist RH and was fined \$500 and ordered 2 hours of extra CE for dispensing the wrong medication to a patient. Pharmacy CV was fined \$495 and ordered corrective action.
- Pharmacists SS and MF were fined \$500 each and ordered 2 hours of extra CE on error prevention for dispensing the wrong medication.
- Pharmacy SO was fined \$1K and ordered to develop a policy on patient pick-up procedures for giving the wrong prescription bag to the wrong patient.
- Pharmacist KG was fined \$2500 & ordered to not work in a compounding pharmacy until properly trained for various compounding errors and procedures.

Other Activity:

- The usual Board business reports were given, including recent and future speaking engagements; reports on national meetings; and collaboration with other state agencies.
- The surety bond for wholesaler BP was reduced as requested after five years of satisfactory practice.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.620, 639.6282, 639.6305 – Third-Party Logistics Providers – The regulation amends the definition of third-party logistics providers (3PLs) to be consistent with the Federal Drug Quality and Security Act (DQSA). The amendment requires that a 3PL obtain a license as an authorized warehouse, rather than being licensed as a wholesaler as they have historically been licensed.
