Marguerite Merchon Carletti / Kitts / Snyder



February 9, 1916

April 7, 2017

A pioneer in Nevadan women's history, Marguerite Merchon Snyder passed into eternal life on April 7th, 2017 at Renown Medical Hospital. Mrs. Snyder was born on February 9, 1916 in Salt Lake City, Utah as the first daughter of Pietro and Hattie Carletti. She grew up at Carletti Ranch, in Pine Valley, Nevada until she graduated from Reno High School in 1933 and enrolled into St. Luke's School of Nursing in San Francisco. Unfortunately, her father passed away in 1934 which caused Marguerite to cease her nursing education and move back to Pine Valley. In 1936 she married Donald Kitts and later gave birth to Donald Jr. (1936) and Karen Louise (1937). Her husband, Donald, passed in 1942 and Marguerite turned

to her education. She enrolled into the Capitol College of Pharmacy in Denver, Colorado in 1945 and graduated in 1947 as a registered Pharmacist in Colorado and Nevada. This was the beginning of her 25 year career in Pharmacy which resulted in many achievements such as the establishment of the first Pharmacy in the state hospital in Sparks, NV, recognition as the first fully licensed woman Pharmacist in Nevada, recognized as Pharmacist of the year by Merck Co, and she was listed in "Who's Who of American Women" in 1970. In 1952 she married Anton "Tony" Snyder. They both were avid square dancers and enjoyed camping in their "Little Loafer" trailer. Marguerite was extremely gifted in many ways and loved to sew, garden, craft, and play her organ. She is survived by her brother James R Carletti, son Donald Kitts Jr. (Jeanette), and daughter Karen Louise Wodke (James); her four grandchildren: Diane, Denise, Lance, and Teresa; her seven great grandchildren: Shane, Ashley, Taylor, Ty, Casey, Rian, and Andrew; and her two great grandchildren: Rook and Benjamin.

A service will be held at Masonic Memorial Gardens at 437 Stoker Ave Reno, NV at 11:00am on Sunday, April 23rd, 2017.

ACTIVITIES REPORT

APRIL 12-13, 2017 BOARD MEETING HELD IN LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

This report is prepared and presented to keep interested legislators and others abreast of the activities of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy. Following is a summary of the April, 2017 Board meeting.

Licensing Activity:

- 6 licenses were granted for Out-of-State MDEG (Medical Devices, Equipment and Gases) companies and 2 granted for Nevada MDEG companies.
- 16 licenses were granted for Out-of-State pharmacies, pending receipt of a favorable inspection for all compounding pharmacies.
- 17 licenses were granted for Out-of-State wholesalers, and 1 license was granted for a Nevada wholesaler.
- 8 licenses were granted for Nevada pharmacies, and 1 application withdrawn.
- Pharmacist YW asked to table her reciprocal pharmacist application pending the outcome of a disciplinary action against her license in California.
- Pharmacist CK was denied a reciprocal license for forging a signature on his application attesting his character.
- Pharmacist AI had her license reinstated (with conditions) after successfully completing rehab for opiate and amphetamine addiction.

Disciplinary Actions:

- Pharmacist MB was fined \$1000; and ordered 4 additional hours of CE for multiple record keeping issues and poor compounding of sterile prescriptions. Additionally, a letter of warning from the Executive Secretary will be sent, and MB will not be allowed to sterile compound until fully retrained.
- Pharmacist JC was reduced to intern status and ordered to complete a college level course in ethics and find a mentor to mentor him for the next 12 months, submitting quarterly reports to Board staff. This due to JC fraudulently filling and billing prescriptions for himself to hoard for "judgement day".
- Pharmaceutical technician CW was revoked for diversion of controlled substances and dangerous drugs as well as theft from her employer of goods.

Other Activity:

- The usual Board business reports were given, including recent and future speaking engagements; reports on national meetings; and collaboration with other state agencies.
- Avera ePharmacy from Sioux Falls, SD was approved for offsite cognitive services in Nevada.
- VLS Pharmacy from Brooklyn, NY was approved to begin sterile and non-sterile compounding.
- Vasudah Gupta, Pharm. D. was approved to practice MTM (Medication Therapy Management) outside of a traditional pharmacy.
