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NEVADA STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

ACTIVITIES REPORT

JULY 20-21, 2016 BOARD MEETING HELD IN LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

This report is prepared and presented to keep interested legislators and others abreast of the activities of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy. Following is a summary of the July, 2016 Board meeting.

Licensing Activity:

- 4 licenses were granted for Out-of-State MDEG (Medical Devices, Equipment and Gases) companies.
- 2 licenses were granted for a Nevada MDEG companies, 1 denied & 2 tabled.
- 25 licenses were granted for Out-of-State pharmacies, pending receipt of a favorable inspection for all compounding pharmacies.
- 21 licenses were granted for Out-of-State wholesalers and 1 tabled pending the outcome of a federal indictment.
- 8 licenses were granted for Nevada pharmacies.
- 1 PA controlled substance registration was granted after demonstration of recovery from controlled substance addiction & 1 tabled for a physician with similar issues.
- Permission was granted to an out-of-state pharmacist to sit for our Board exam with restrictions resulting from past discipline.
- 1 license was granted (with restrictions) to an MD who had let both his dispensing and CS registrations elapse, yet continued to practice & another granted to resolved past discipline.
- 1 pharmacy tech was granted registration pending evaluation by PRN-PRN for THC abuse and another denied.

Disciplinary Actions:

- Pharmacy WM was fined #1K plus admin fees for dispensing a CII drug without custody of the actual prescription (it was given back to the patient who then had it filled at another pharmacy as well). P&P changes were mandated as well.
- Pharmacists DS and CP were fined and ordered public letters of reprimand for numerous violations of Nevada compounding laws.
- Pharmacist LB was fined \$1000 plus admin fees and ordered to sit for the PARE Exam after her license was suspended (then stayed) for failing to complete the mandatory CE requirements.

Other Activity:

- The usual Board business reports were given, including recent and future speaking engagements; reports on national meetings; and collaboration with other state agencies.

- The budget for fiscal 16-17 was presented and approved.
- The Board approved a request by the AG regarding dispensing practitioners.

WORKSHOP:

A. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.7102 Use of computer system for issuance and transmission of prescription The regulation currently allows the Board to approve a computer system for issuance and transmission of a prescription to a pharmacy only if the computer system limits access to the prescribing practitioner. The proposed amendment would allow the Board to approve computer systems that allow prescribers to designate delegates who have the authority to access the system to perform prescription-related functions on the practitioner's behalf.

B. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.7105 Electronic transmission of prescription The regulation currently requires that only a practitioner may access a computer system used for issuance and transmission of a prescription to a pharmacy. The proposed amendment would allow a practitioner to authorize delegates to access such a computer system to perform prescription-related functions on the practitioner's behalf.

PUBLIC HEARING:

A. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.921 Sharing of information between two or more pharmacies. The proposed amendment would allow for the sharing of information concerning prescriptions between the computerized system of two or more pharmacies that are commonly owned or contractually related.

B. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.NEW LANGUAGE New language to be added to NAC Chapter 639, pursuant to the Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act, SB 459 (2015), establishing standardized procedures or protocols for the furnishing of opioid antagonists by pharmacists and other appropriate entities to persons at risk of experiencing and opioid-related overdose or to a family member, friend or other person in a position to assist persons at risk of experiencing an opioid-related drug overdose.

C. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.NEW LANGUAGE and 453C.NEW LANGUAGE Additional new language to be added to NAC Chapter 639 and NAC Chapter 453C, pursuant to the Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act, SB 459 (2015), establishing standardized procedures or protocols for the furnishing of opioid antagonists by pharmacists and other appropriate entities to persons at risk of experiencing and opioid-related overdose or to a family member, friend or other person in a position to assist persons at risk of experiencing an opioid-related drug overdose.
