ACTIVITIES REPORT

OCTOBER 12-13, 2016 BOARD MEETING HELD IN LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

This report is prepared and presented to keep interested legislators and others abreast of the activities of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy. Following is a summary of the October, 2016 Board meeting.

Licensing Activity:

- 9 licenses were granted for Out-of-State MDEG (Medical Devices, Equipment and Gases) companies.
- 1 license was granted for a Nevada MDEG company and 1 denied due to an ownership dispute.
- 15 licenses were granted for Out-of-State pharmacies, pending receipt of a favorable inspection for all compounding pharmacies.
- 9 licenses were granted for Out-of-State wholesalers.
- 4 licenses were granted for Nevada pharmacies.
- 1 license was granted for a Nevada wholesaler.
- 1 PA controlled substance registration was granted after consideration of his rehabilitation from past criminal activity.
- Physician MY was granted a controlled substance registration after consideration of past regulatory allegations in another state.
- Pharmacy technician RP was granted a conditional license pending clarification of the status of her California license and past criminal history.

Disciplinary Actions:

- Pharmacist AK surrendered his license and will give up ownership in his pharmacy for felony fraudulent prescription activity, including fraudulent billing. Pharmacy technician AW was revoked for her activity in the above scheme.
- Pharmacists PL and SC were fined \$1K each and ordered 2 hours of CE on error prevention for misfilling two prescriptions within a 2 month period for the same child. Pharmacy WG was fined \$990 in administrative fees and ordered a review and fix of their policies and procedures to prevent further such errors.
- Pharmacist RC was fined \$1250 and ordered 4 hours of CE on error prevention and patient counseling for dispensing the wrong strength of a controlled substance.
 Pharmacy KM was ordered a change in their documentation of counseling procedures.

Other Activity:

- The usual Board business reports were given, including recent and future speaking engagements; reports on national meetings; and collaboration with other state agencies.

- Discussions were held on PMP data input; the Comprehensive Addiction & Recovery Act of 2016; discharge prescriptions from medical facilities and the formation of an ad hoc committee on different prescription filling models.

WORKSHOP:

- A. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.7102 Use of computer system for issuance and transmission of prescription. The regulation currently allows the Board to approve a computer system for issuance and transmission of a prescription to a pharmacy only if the computer system limits access to the prescribing practitioner. The proposed amendment would allow the Board to approve computer systems that allow prescribers to designate delegates who have the authority to access the system to perform prescription—related functions on the practitioner's behalf.
- B. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.7105
 Electronic transmission of prescription The regulation currently requires that only a practitioner may access a computer system used for issuance and transmission of a prescription to a pharmacy. The proposed amendment would allow a practitioner to authorize delegates to access such a computer system to perform prescription—related functions on the practitioner's behalf.
- C. Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 453C.NEW LANGUAGE Additional new language to be added to NAC Chapter 639 and NAC Chapter 453C, pursuant to the Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act, SB 459 (2015), establishing standardized procedures or protocols for the furnishing of opioid antagonists by pharmacists and other appropriate entities to persons at risk of experiencing and opioid-related overdose or to a family member, friend or other person in a position to assist persons at risk of experiencing an opioid-related drug.
