Respondent above named, in answer to the Notice of Intended Action and Accusation filed in the above-entitled matter before the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, declares:

1. That his/her objection to the Notice of Intended Action and Accusation as being incomplete or failing to state clearly the charges against him/her, is hereby interposed on the following grounds: (State specific objections or insert "none").

As it relates to Case No. 22-344-PH-N, we object to the inclusion of the factual allegations listed below (4. and 8.), as they are related to Case No. 22-344-RPH-N.

- Factual Allegation 4. On or about August 12, 2022, Clemons left employment as the Managing Pharmacist at Smith's #389 and took a job as the Managing Pharmacist at a CVS Pharmacy located in Carson City, Nevada.
- Factual Allegation 8. Clemons notified the Board of her change of practice location on September 19, 2022, which was more than 10 days after changing her place of practice.

2. That, in answer to the Notice of Intended Action and Accusation, he/she admits, denies and alleges as follows:

Respondent Smith's #389 denies Count Two as it pertains to Respondent Clemons and Case No. 22-344-RPH-N.

Respondent Smith's #389 admits to Counts One and Three as listed.

We have researched the situation and determined the following, as it relates to both Counts One and Three:

- On August 12, 2022, Karah Clemons, managing pharmacist at Smith's Pharmacy #389, vacated her position. Unfortunately, despite having the position posted, no replacement managing pharmacist had been hired or identified prior to Karah Clemons's departure date.
- It was the understanding of overseeing Pharmacy Practice Coordinator (PPC) that the Nevada Board of Pharmacy (BOP) was to be notified upon identifying a replacement managing pharmacist for Smith's Pharmacy #389.
- During a Nevada BOP inspection on August 24th, 2022, it was identified that Smith's Pharmacy #389 was out of compliance with NRS 639.220(1) and (5).
- The overseeing PPC had a subsequent conversation on August 31st, 2022 with the BOP representative to ensure a proper understating of NRS 639.220(1) and (5). As a result, Marcy Rathjen Rouse, was identified as the replacement managing pharmacist for Smith's Pharmacy #389 on September 1, 2022, at which time the required application was submitted to the NV BOP.

We regret the oversight which led to Counts One and Three in Case No. 22-344-PH-N. We are committed to operating within the constraints of Nevada laws, as well as to the safety and welfare of our patients. Effective immediately, the below procedures have implemented to avoid a similar situation in the future:

- NRS 639.220(1) and (5) reviewed with all Smith's Pharmacy PPCs overseeing pharmacy locations in Nevada
- The overseeing PPC will designated an incoming managing pharmacist prior to the departure date of the outgoing managing pharmacist.
- To ensure timely completion and notification, the overseeing PPC provides the incoming managing pharmacist with the "Change in Managing Pharmacist/Pharmacist in Charge/Supervising Pharmacist Application", including the credit card authorization.
- Upon completion, the incoming managing pharmacist submits the application via USPS
 mail to Nevada BOP and files the application, according to company guidance.
 Additionally, the incoming managing pharmacist notifies the overseeing PPC of
 application completion and submission.

Lastly, Smith's Pharmacy #389 is willing to enter into a consent order to avoid the necessity of the July 12th, 2023 scheduled hearing.

- J. David Wuest, in his official capacity as Executive Secretary of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, by and through its General Counsel, Peter K. Keegan, Esq., and Respondent, Smith's Pharmacy #389 ("Smith's #389"), Pharmacy License No. PH00976, HEREBY STIPULATE AND AGREE THAT:
 - 1. The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent and these matters.
- 2. On or about June 5, 2023, Board Staff served Respondent Smith's #389 with the Notice of Intended Action and Accusation ("Accusation") on file in this matter together with the Statement to Respondent and Notice of Hearing.
- Respondent, in lieu of filing an Answer, submit this Stipulation and Order for the Board's consideration.
- 4. Respondent is aware of the right to seek the advice of counsel in this matter and prior to entering this Stipulation.
- 5. Respondent is aware of the right to a hearing on the matters alleged in the Accusation, their right to reconsideration, their right to appeal, and any and all other rights which may be accorded pursuant to NRS Chapter 233B, Nevada Administrative Procedure Act, NRS Chapter 622A, Administrative Procedure Before Certain Regulatory Bodies, and NRS Chapter 639, Nevada Pharmacy Act.

- 6. Conditioned on the acceptance of this Stipulation by the Board, and with the exception of the right to challenge any determination that Respondent, or any of them, have failed to comply with the provisions of this Stipulation, Respondent hereby freely and voluntarily waive their rights to a hearing, reconsideration, appeal and any and all other rights related to this action that may be accorded to them by NRS Chapter 233B, Nevada Administrative Procedure Act, NRS Chapter 622A, Administrative Procedure Before Certain Regulatory Bodies, and NRS Chapter 639, Nevada Pharmacy Act.
- 7. Respondent admits that evidence exists, and that Board's staff prosecuting this case could present such evidence at an administrative hearing, to establish a factual basis for certain of the violations alleged in the Accusation, that:
- A. Respondent Smith's #389 violated NRS 639.220(1) when it operated a pharmacy without a managing pharmacist during the period of August 12, 2022, to September 1, 2022; therefore, Respondent Smith's #389 is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to NRS 639.210(12) and/or NRS 639.255.
- These violations are plead with particularity in the Accusation, and are grounds for disciplinary action against Respondent pursuant to NRS 639.210 and/or NRS 639.255.
- 9. In order to resolve this matter without incurring any further costs or the expense associated with a hearing, the Board and Respondent Smith's #389, Certificate of Registration No. PH00976, stipulate to the following penalties and/or conditions:
 - A. Respondent Smith's #389 shall pay a fine of Five-Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the violations; and
 - B. Respondent Smith's #389 shall pay Five-Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to partially reimburse the Board for recoverable attorney's fees and investigative costs.
- 10. Any failure by any Respondent to comply with the terms of this Order may result in issuance by the Executive Secretary of an order to show cause pursuant to NAC 639.965 directing the non-compliant Respondent to appear before the Board at the next regularly scheduled meeting for a show cause hearing. If such a hearing results in a finding of a violation of this Order

by any Respondent, the Board may impose additional discipline upon the non-compliant Respondent(s) consistent with the provisions of NRS Chapter 639.

- 11. General Counsel will present this Stipulation to the Board for approval pursuant to NRS 622.330 at the Board's regularly scheduled public meeting on July 12, 2023, in Reno, Nevada. Respondent will appear in person at the meeting to answer questions from the Board Members and/or Board Staff. The Board Members and Staff may discuss and deliberate regarding this Stipulation, even if Respondent or counsel are not present at the meeting.
- 12. The Board has discretion to accept this Stipulation, but it is not obligated to do so. If this Stipulation is approved by the Board, it shall be a public record pursuant to NRS 622.330 and shall be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank pursuant to 42 USC § 1396r–2 and 45 CFR Part 60.
- 13. If the Board rejects any part or all of this Stipulation, and unless they reach an alternative agreement on the record during the hearing, the parties agree that a full hearing on the merits of this matter may be heard by the Board on the same day or at a later date. The terms and admissions herein may not be used or referred to in a full hearing on the merits of this matter.
- 14. Upon approval of this Stipulation by the Board, Respondent shall pay the fines agreed to herein by *personal check, business check, cashier's check* or *certified check* or *money order* made payable to "State of Nevada, Office of the Treasurer," to be received by the Board's Reno office located at 985 Damonte Ranch Parkway Suite 206, Reno, Nevada 89521, within thirty (30) days of entry of this Order.
- 15. Upon approval of this Stipulation by the Board, Respondent shall pay the attorney's fees and investigative costs agreed to herein by *personal check, business check, cashier's check* or *certified check* or *money order* made payable to "Nevada State Board of Pharmacy," to be received by the Board's Reno office located at 985 Damonte Ranch Parkway Suite 206, Reno, Nevada 89521, within thirty (30) days of entry of this Order.
- 16. Subject to the approval of this Stipulation by the Board, the Board and Respondent agree to release one another from any and all additional claims arising from the facts set forth in the Accusation on file herein, whether known or unknown that might otherwise have existed on or before the effective date of this Order.

Respondent have fully considered the charges and allegations contained in the *Notice of Intended Action and Accusation* in this matter, and the terms of this Stipulation, and have freely and voluntarily agreed to the terms set forth herein, and waived certain rights, as stated herein.

STIPULATED FACTS

Peter Keegan, Esq., General Counsel for the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, and William Stilling, Esq., counsel for Respondents, Joseph DeLallo, RPh. ("DeLallo"), Certificate of Registration No. 18429, and CVS Pharmacy #4691 ("CVS 4691"), License No. PH02471,

HEREBY STIPULATE TO THE FOLLOWING OPERATIVE FACTS IN THIS MATTER:

1. The Nevada State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") has jurisdiction over this matter because, at the time of the events alleged herein, Respondent DeLallo, Certificate of Registration No. 18429, and Respondent, CVS 4691, License No. PH02471.

PRIOR DISCIPLINE (DeLallo)

- 2. On or about February 18, 2022, Respondent DeLallo was mailed a \$500.00 Citation and Fine in Case No. 19-008-RPH-N for a medication misfill of Guanfacine HCL ER 3MG TB24 with incorrect directions "take 3 tablets by mouth at bedtime," instead of the prescribed "take 3mg by moth every bedtime." Respondent DeLallo timely paid the \$500.00 fine.
- 3. On or about September 3, 2014, Respondent DeLallo Stipulated in Case No. 14-023-RPH-N to pay (i) a \$750.00 fine for the medication misfill of a prescription for Cedax 400mg capsules with Citalopram 40mg; (ii) complete one additional hours of CE in the area of "error prevention;" (iii) pay a fine of \$750.00 for a counseling violation; (iv) complete additional CVS

corporate pharmacist training; and (v) pay a \$45.00 administrative fingerprinting fee. Respondent DeLallo timely complied with the terms of the Stipulation.

PRIOR DISCIPLINE (CVS #4691)

- 4. On or about March 6, 2019, Respondent CVS #4691 stipulated in Case No. 17-089-PH-N to pay (i) a \$1,000.00 fine; and (ii) \$1,500.00 in attorney's fees and costs for deleting and/or having a system that allowed its employee to delete a prescription record or portion of a prescription record, specifically by removing the original data and eliminating any reference of a filling error; as well as for failing to maintain a record keeping system that would allow for readily retrievable prescription records. CVS #4691 further stipulated to take the necessary corrective action regarding its electronic record keeping system.
- 5. On or about June 5, 2019, Respondent CVS #4691 stipulated in Case No. 18-086-PH-N to pay (i) a \$500.00 fine and \$750.00 in attorney fees and costs as the pharmacy/pharmacy owner liable for (i) allowing two pharmaceutical technicians to work with expired registrations; (ii) the dispensation of medication to the wrong patient by a pharmaceutical technician operating the point of sale under a different pharmaceutical technician's credentials and (iii) the unprofessional conduct of a pharmaceutical technician who failed to maintain the security of her password.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- Respondent DeLallo was employed by CVS #4691, Certificate of Registration No.
 PH02471, located at 5151 Sparks Blvd., Sparks, NV 89436, as the managing pharmacist at the time of the events alleged herein.
- 7. Anup Chabra, RPh. ("Chabra"), was employed by CVS #4691 as a pharmacist at the time of the events alleged herein.

- 8. Maria Camila Giraldo Piedrahita, P.T. ("Giraldo Piedrahita"), was employed by CVS #4691 as a pharmaceutical technician at the time of the events alleged herein.
- On March 13, 2022, a prescription refill for Mercaptopurine 50mg #60 tablets, issued to patient C.L., was processed at by CVS #4691 for patient C.L. and designated as RX #1178244 CVS's computer system.
- 10. On March 13, 2022, pharmacist Chabra, performed the Drug Utilization Review ("DUR") override, warning verification, data entry verification, and patient age check for RX #1178244 within CVS #4691's computer system.
- 11. On March 14, 2022, pharmaceutical technician Giraldo Piedrahita printed the label, filled, and performed the multipackage confirmation scan for RX #1178244.
- 12. On March 14, 2022, managing pharmacist, Respondent DeLallo verified and dispensed RX #1178244 to patient C.L.
- 13. Beginning the first week of April 2022, patient C.L. began taking tablets from the bottle containing RX #1178244; after taking the tablets for approximately one (1) week patient C.L. noticed the bottle contained different size tablets.
- 14. On April 10, 2022, patient C.L. reported to the Renown Hospital emergency room upon suspicion of ingesting unknown medication mixed into RX #1178244.
- 15. Pharmacy staff at Renown Hospital determined the unknown tablets mixed into RX #1178244 were 250mg Mefloquine, a Malaria prevention drug.
- 16. Patient C.L. was examined by Renown medical staff and discharged in "good" condition.

Respondent(s) have fully considered the charges and allegations contained in the *Notice of Intended Action and Accusation* in this matter, and has knowingly and voluntarily agreed to the stipulated facts set forth herein and thereby waived certain rights to contest the stipulated facts and to require the State to prove each stipulated fact by a preponderance of evidence.

DECLARATION OF MONICA SEGEDY

- I, Monica Segedy, hereby state the following:
- I am an investigator employed by the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy ("Board").
 Pursuant to NRS 53.045, I have made this declaration at the request of Peter K. Keegan, General Counsel, for his use in the above-entitled administrative action.
- 2. As an investigator for the Board, I am responsible for investigating administrative disciplinary cases involving alleged violations of chapters 453 and 639 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS). In this regard, I investigate persons and companies who are subject to the Board's regulatory jurisdiction, including physicians, advance practice registered nurses, pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, dispensing technicians, pharmacies, wholesalers, manufacturers, and other persons who prescribe, dispense, sell, and/or distribute dangerous drugs and/or controlled substances.
- 3. I have access to InLumon, the Board's electronic database which contains information maintained in the Board's normal course of business operations including the investigation of complaints and the licensing of parties under the Board's jurisdiction.
- 4. As part of my job responsibilities as an investigator, I prepared an investigative report, dated September 12, 2022, which details my investigation of the complaint filed with the Board against CVS Pharmacy #4691 and Joseph DeLallo, RPh. A true and correct copy of my Investigative Report is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

- 5. A copy of the patient's complaint to the Board along with the photographs attached hereto is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**.
- 6. During my investigation I obtained a copy of the complaining patient's prescription for mercaptopurine 50 mg #60 oral tablets from CVS. The prescription at issue was designated as prescription no. 1178244 by CVS. A copy of my investigation report is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.
- 7. During my investigation I obtained a copy of the credential history and POS information for prescription no. 1178244 from CVS. The credential history and POS information is an electronic chronology maintained by CVS detailing the receipt, filling, and dispensation of prescription no. 1178244. A copy of CVS's fill chronology is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4.**
- 8. During my investigation I obtained medical records from Renown Regional Medical Center for the complaining patient. The patient's medical records indicate she presented on April 10, 2022, and expressed concern that she had ingested medication that was incorrectly comingled with her CVS prescription. Copies of the medical records are attached hereto as Exhibit 5.
- 9. As part of my investigation, I obtained a declaration from William Andrew Bell, RPh., who was the pharmacist on staff at Renown Regional Medical Center on April 10, 2022. The Declaration reflects Pharmacists Bell's findings upon evaluating the contents of the complaining patient's prescription bottle for CVS prescription no. 1178244. A copy of Pharmacist Bell's declaration is attached hereto as Exhibit 6.
- 10. At the request of Peter Keegan, I performed a search of InLumon, the Board's electronic database, and I verified that Respondent DeLallo had past discipline including:
 - a. a \$500.00 Citation and Fine in Case No. 19-008-RPH-N for a medication misfill; and
 - b. a Stipulation in Case No. 14-023-RPH-N to pay (i) a \$750.00 fine for a medication misfill of a prescription for Cedax 400mg capsules with Citalopram 40mg; (ii) complete one additional hours of CE in the area of "error prevention;" (iii) pay a fine of \$750.00 for a counseling violation; (iv) complete additional CVS corporate pharmacist training; and (v) pay a \$45.00 administrative fingerprinting fee.

Copies of the Citation and Fine in Case No. 19-008-RPH-N as well as the Stipulation in Case No. 14-023-RPH-N are attached here to as Exhibit 7.

11. At the request of Mr. Keegan, I also performed a search of InLumon, the Board's electronic database, and I verified that Respondent CVS #4691 had past discipline including:

a. a Stipulation in Case No. 17-089-PH-N to pay (i) a \$1,000.00 fine and \$1,500.00 in attorney fees and costs for failing to maintain records in a readily retrievable manner and for deleting and/or having a system that allowed its employee to delete records, or a portion of records, specifically by removing the original data and eliminating any

reference to a filling error; and

b. a Stipulation in Case No. 18-086-PH-N to pay (i) a \$500.00 fine and \$750.00 in attorney fees and costs as the pharmacy/pharmacy owner liable for (i) allowing two pharmaceutical technicians to work with expired registrations; (ii) the dispensation of medication to the wrong patient by a pharmaceutical technician operating the point of sale under a different pharmaceutical technician's credentials and (iii) the unprofessional conduct of a pharmaceutical technician who failed to maintain the security of her password.

Copies of the Stipulations in Case Nos. Case No. 17-089-PH-N and 18-086-PH-N are attached here to as Exhibit 8.

On 4/10/2022, after L reported to the ER, The Renown Regional Hospital Pharmacy determined Rx#1178244 was mis-filled and mixed with at least two or more tablets of 250 mg Mefloquine, a drug for the treatment of Malaria. **Contact with Complainant** On 4/13/2022 Monica S. Segedy telephonically contacted C . After being advised of the identity of the interviewing investigator and the purpose of the contact Lancaster provided the following information: On 3/13/2022 she had her prescription of Mercaptopurine filled at CVS Pharmacy on Sparks Blvd., Sparks, NV. Lancaster takes Mercaptopurine for ulcerative colitis. Inasmuch as L had pills left from her previous prescription, she did not start taking the pills from the 3/13/2022 prescription until the first week in April 2022. After taking the medication for about one week she noticed some of

the pills were smaller than the others. Since L did not know what she had

taken she reported to the Renown Emergency Room on Mills St., Reno NV on 4/10/2022, and she brought the pills with her.

Less was examined by Dr. John R. Hardwick who conducted several blood tests and an EKG. Dr. Hardwick reported that Less was fine, and she did not suffer any known ill effects of the unknown medication.

Dr. Hardwick took the unknown medication to the Renown Pharmacy, who later determined that the unknown medication was 250 MG Mefloquine mixed with her prescribed Mercaptopurine.

Land advised her prescribing physician is Dr. William Pfau.

Lamprovided four (4) photos of the prescription in question which was given Rx# 1178244 by CVS Pharmacy, a copy of the description of the incorrect drug mixed with her Mercaptopurine, and a copy of the Renown ER "After Visit Summary."

Renown Pharmacy identified the unknown drug as 250 MG Mefloquine, a drug for the prevention of Malaria.

On 4/19/2022 Monica S. Segedy spoke with RPh Holly Yin at CVS Pharmacy 5151 Sparks Blvd., Sparks, NV and requested the following documents:

- 1. Copy of the original script for Rx#1178244 in the name of C L L DOB dated on or about 3/13/2022 from her prescriber Dr. William Pfau.
- 2. Identification of who filled and verified Rx#1178244
- 3. The date the prescription was filled and dispensed.

Request for Records from Renown

On 4/19/2022 Monica S. Segedy contacted Pharm D James Milner, Renown Regional Hospital, at (775) 982-3622 and requested the following records:

- 1. Identification of Pharmacy personnel who examined pills in question brought in by patient Case Land, DOB when she reported to the ER on 4/10/2022.
- 2. Identification of the pills in question



Brett Kandt, General Counsel for Petitioner the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy (Board), and Respondent CVS PHARMACY #4691 ("CVS"), Certificate of Registration No. PH02471, by and through counsel, Michael W. Dyer, Esq., HEREBY STIPULATE AND AGREE THAT:

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent CVS and this matter.
- On or about October 24, 2018, Board Staff properly served the Notice of Intended
 Action and Accusation (Accusation) on file in this matter on Respondent CVS.
 - 3. Respondent CVS filed an Answer to the Accusation on or about January 11, 2019.
- 4. Respondent CVS is fully aware of its right to seek the advice of counsel in this matter and obtained the advice of counsel prior to entering into this Stipulation.

- 5. Respondent CVS is aware of its right to a hearing on the matters alleged in the Accusation, its right to reconsideration, its right to appeal and any and all other rights which may be accorded to it pursuant to NRS Chapter 233B (Nevada Administrative Procedure Act), NRS Chapter 622A (Administrative Procedure Before Certain Regulatory Bodies), and NRS Chapter 639 (Nevada Pharmacy Act).
- 6. Conditioned on the acceptance of this Stipulation by the Board, and with the exception of the right to challenge any determination that Respondent CVS has failed to comply with the provisions of Paragraphs 9, 14 and/or 15 below, Respondent CVS hereby freely and voluntarily waive its rights to a hearing, reconsideration, appeal and any and all other rights related to this action that may be accorded to it by NRS Chapter 233B (Nevada Administrative Procedure Act), NRS Chapter 622A (Administrative Procedure Before Certain Regulatory Bodies), and NRS Chapter 639 (Nevada Pharmacy Act).
 - 7. Respondent CVS does not contest the allegations in the Accusation, to wit, that:
- A. Respondents Nuttavat Rojprasitporn (Rojprasitporn), Certificate of Registration No. 19161, Jeffrey Arbogast (Arbogast), Certificate of Registration No. 16986, and Mui Ching Lee (Lee), Certificate of Registration No. 08993, were pharmacists registered by the Board and employed by Respondent CVS #4691. Respondent Lydia Pasero (Pasero), Certificate of Registration No. PT08989, was a pharmaceutical technician registered by the Board and employed by Respondent CVS #4691.
- B. Rojprasitporn engaged in unprofessional conduct in violation of NAC 639.945(1)(d) and (i) by dispensing thirty (30) chlordiazepoxide 25 mg. capsules to P.C., a patient who did not have a prescription for that schedule IV-controlled substance, when he either verified the label on Prescription No. 0613015 as accurate when it was incorrect, or by failing to verify the label and prescription before CVS dispensed it.

- C. Arbogast violated NRS 639.266, NAC 639.707(1) and (2) and engaged in unprofessional conduct and conduct contrary to the public interest as defined in NAC 639.945(1)(i) by failing to counsel P.C. regarding Prescription No. 0613015.
- D. Pasero violated NAC 639.482, NAC 639.485 and NAC 639.910(1) and engaged in unprofessional conduct and conduct contrary to the public interest by deleting the record, or a portion of the record, for Prescription No. 0613015, specifically by removing the original data and eliminating any reference of the filling error.
- E. Respondent CVS violated NAC 639.482, NAC 639.485 and/or NAC 639.910(1) by deleting and/or having a system that allowed its employee, Pasero, to delete the record, or a portion of the record, for Prescription No. 0613015, specifically by removing the original data and eliminating any reference of the filling error.
- F. By failing to maintain records for Prescription No. 0613015 in a readily retrievable manner, by failing to timely provide documents to Board Staff upon request, and by failing to maintain a recordkeeping system that would allow for readily retrievable prescription records for Prescription No. 0613015, Respondent CVS violated NAC 639.751(1)(b) and (2), NAC 639.930(3), (4) and (5), and NAC 639.935(3)(g)(3).
- G. Lee, as the managing pharmacist of CVS Pharmacy #4691 at the time of each of the violations alleged above, is responsible for those violations pursuant to NRS 639.210(15), NRS 639.220(3)(c), NAC 639.702 and NAC 639.910(2); and
- H. As the pharmacy in which the violations occurred, Respondent CVS is responsible for those violations, including those committed by Rojprasitporn, Arbogast, Pasero, and Lee pursuant to NRS 639.230(5), NAC 639.702 and NAC 639.945(2).
- Those violations are plead with particularity in the Accusation, and are grounds for action pursuant to NRS 639.210 and NRS 639.255.
- In order to resolve this matter without incurring any further costs or the expense associated with a hearing, and without Respondent CVS admitting to the allegations in the

Accusation, the Board and Respondent CVS stipulate to the following penalties. Respondent CVS Pharmacy #4691, Certificate of Registration No. PH02471, shall:

- A. Pay a fine of One-Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) associated with the violations indicated above; and
- B. Pay an administrative fee of One-Thousand Five-Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) to partially reimburse the Board for the costs and expenses incurred in investigating and prosecuting this matter.

Furthermore, Respondent CVS represents and warrants that CVS Pharmacy has taken all necessary corrective action in conformance with Paragraph 11(C) of the Stipulation and Order entered in Case No. 16-036.

- 10. Any failure by Respondent CVS to comply with the terms of this Order may result in issuance by the Executive Secretary of an order to show cause directing Respondent CVS to appear before the Board at the next regularly-scheduled meeting for a show cause hearing. If such a hearing results in a finding of a violation of this Order by Respondent CVS, the Board may impose additional discipline upon Respondent CVS not inconsistent with the provisions of NRS Chapter 639.
- 11. General Counsel will present this Stipulation to the Board for approval pursuant to NRS 622.330 at the Board's regularly scheduled public meeting on March 6, 2019, in Reno, Nevada. Respondent CVS's authorized representative(s) will appear at the meeting to answer questions from the Board Members and/or Board Staff. The Board Members and Staff may discuss and deliberate regarding this Stipulation, even if Respondent CVS or its counsel are not present at the meeting.
- 12. The Board has discretion to accept this Stipulation, but it is not obligated to do so.
 If this Stipulation is approved by the Board it shall be a public record pursuant to NRS 622.330.
- 13. If the Board rejects any part or all of this Stipulation, and unless they reach an alternative agreement on the record during the hearing, the parties agree that a full hearing on the

merits of this matter may be heard by the Board. The terms and admissions herein may not be used or referred to in a full hearing on the merits of this matter.

- 14. Upon approval of this Stipulation by the Board, Respondent CVS shall pay the fine agreed to herein by *cashier's check* or *certified check* or *money order* made payable to "State of Nevada, Office of the Treasurer," to be received by the Board's Reno office located at 985 Damonte Ranch Parkway Suite 206, Reno, Nevada 89521, within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Order.
- 15. Upon approval of this Stipulation by the Board, Respondent CVS shall pay the administrative fee agreed to herein by *cashier's check* or *certified check* or *money order* made payable to "Nevada State Board of Pharmacy," to be received by the Board's Reno office located at 985 Damonte Ranch Parkway Suite 206, Reno, Nevada 89521, within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Order;
- 16. Subject to the approval of this Stipulation by the Board, the Board and Respondent CVS agree to release each other from any and all additional claims arising from the facts set forth in the Accusation on file herein, whether known or unknown that might otherwise have existed on or before the effective date of this Order.

Respondent CVS has fully considered the charges and allegations contained in the Notice of Intended Action and Accusation in this matter, and the terms of this Stipulation, and has freely and voluntarily agreed to the terms set forth herein, and waived certain rights, as stated herein.

Larry L. Pinson, in his official capacity as Executive Secretary of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, makes the following that will serve as both a notice of intended action under Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 233B.127(3) and as an accusation under NRS 639.241.

JURISDICTION

[.

The Nevada State Board of Pharmacy (Board) has jurisdiction over this matter and these respondents because at the time of the alleged events, respondents Nuttavat Rojprasitporn (Rojprasitporn), Certificate of Registration No. 19161, Jeffrey Arbogast (Arbogast), Certificate

of Registration No. 16986, and Mui Ching Lee (Lee), Certificate of Registration No. 08993, were pharmacists registered by the Board. Additionally, respondent Lydia Pasero (Pasero), Certificate of Registration No. PT08989, was a pharmaceutical technician registered by the Board, and respondent CVS Pharmacy #4691, Certificate of Registration No. PH02471 (CVS), was a pharmacy registered by the Board.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

Π.

On December 30, 2016, APRN C.J. separately examined and prescribed medications to P.C. and his girlfriend R.D.

III.

P.C. was prescribed dextroamphetamine salts XR (Adderall XR) 25 mg. capsules with instructions to take one capsule every day.

IV.

R.D. was prescribed chlordiazepoxide 25 mg. with instructions to take one capsule every 8 hours as needed for anxiety.

٧.

P.C. and R.D. tendered their prescriptions to CVS the same day where pharmaceutical technician Gisela Ochoa (Ochoa) performed the pre-data entry scan in CVS's computer system.

VI.

During the pre-data entry scan, Ochoa mistakenly entered R.D.'s chlordiazepoxide prescription under P.C.'s name and patient profile.

VΠ.

CVS processed and dispensed both of the prescriptions later that day.

VIII.

When he arrived at home, P.C. discovered that the contents of the CVS bag contained the dextroamphetamine salts XR 25 mg. capsules (Prescription No. 0613014) as prescribed. The bag also included a second medication bottle containing chlordiazepoxide 25 mg. capsules (Prescription No. 0613015). The prescription label on both medication bottles included P.C.'s name and address.

IX.

P.C. assumed that the chlordiazepoxide 25 mg. capsules were also prescribed to him so he ingested a dose per the instructions on the label.

X.

Later that evening, P.C. ingested alcoholic beverages. P.C. believes that the alcohol interacted with the chlordiazepoxide causing him to become extremely intoxicated and causing his subsequent arrest for driving under the influence.

XI.

On January 1, 2017, R.D. contacted CVS to inform it that the chlordiazepoxide prescribed to her was dispensed to P.C. Pharmacist Arbogast confirmed that CVS dispensed chlordiazepoxide to P.C. in error.

XII.

P.C. ingested approximately 3-5 doses of the wrong medication before discovering the error.

ХШ.

Rojprasitporn is on record as the pharmacist who performed data entry verification and product verification for Prescription No. 0613015. To the extent Rojprasitporn performed any verification at all, he failed to detect during those processes that CVS was preparing to dispense the medication to the wrong patient.

XIV.

Arbogast is on record as the counseling pharmacist for Prescription No. 0613015.

Arbogast did not counsel P.C. regarding Prescription No. 0613015, nor did he offer counseling to P.C.

XV.

Approximately five (5) hours after CVS sold the product, Arbogast entered into CVS's computer system that P.C. declined counseling.

XVI.

On January 18, 2017, approximately seventeen days after P.C. discovered CVS's dispensing error, Pasero deleted records regarding Prescription No. 0613015 from CVS's computer system.

XVII.

A Board Investigator requested a copy of the original prescription records, including the workflow documents, for Prescription No. 0613015 from the managing pharmacist at CVS on September 21, 2017. The request asked that CVS submit the records by no later than October 4, 2017.

XVIII.

Having received no reply to his initial request for records, the Board Investigator met with Arbogast on November 2, 2017, at CVS. Arbogast was unable to provide any record of Prescription No. 0613015 from CVS's computer system.

XIX.

During his November 2 interview with the Board Investigator, Arbogast produced a typewritten, signed statement on letter head from One CVS Drive, Woonsocket, Rhode Island. That statement was dated October 3, 2017.

XX.

With Arbogast's statement was a clear plastic zip lock-style bag containing various documents relating to Prescription No. 0613015, including handwritten notes and copies of computer screens that have since been deleted from CVS's records.

XXI.

When the Board Investigator asked for a copy of the documents in the plastic bag related to Prescription No. 0613015, Arbogast stated that he would first have to clear their release with CVS's corporate office.

XXII.

On November 14, 2017, nearly two months after the Board Investigator's September 21 request for records, CVS Manager of Pharmacy Regulatory Affairs, Leigh Parenteau, wrote an email to the Board Investigator requesting a list of the specific additional records the Board's Investigator needed for the investigation. The Board Investigator responded with a list the same day.

XXIII.

After significant email, telephonic and facsimile communications through May 2018,

Parenteau provided some records related to Prescription No. 613015 to the Board Investigator.

Through primarily key stroke logs, Parenteau was able to piece together the fill history for Prescription No. 613014 and 613015.

XXIV.

During the course of the investigation, CVS and/or each of the Respondents failed to timely provide documents, data and information to the Board Investigator because those records were not readily retrievable.

XXV.

Mui Ching Lee was the managing pharmacist at CVS at the time of the events alleged herein.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

Unprofessional Conduct: Mislabeling and Dispensing to the Wrong Patient (Respondent Rojprasitporn)

XXVI.

Unprofessional conduct includes the failure by a licensee to follow strictly the instructions of a practitioner when labeling and dispensing a prescription. See NAC 639.945(1)(d). It also includes a licensee performing his duties in an "incompetent, unskillful or negligent manner". See NAC 639.945(1)(i).

Additionally, NAC 639.252 states in relevant part:

If a pharmaceutical technician performs one or more of the functions necessary to prepare a prescription, the pharmacist

supervising the pharmaceutical technician is responsible for the filled prescription, including, but not limited to, verifying:

- (a) The selection and strength of the drug;
- (b) The dosage form; and
- (c) The labeling of the prescription.

NAC 639.252(2) (emphasis added.)

Respondent Rojprasitporn engaged in unprofessional conduct in violation of NAC 639.945(1)(d) and (i) and he is responsible for dispensing thirty (30) chlordiazepoxide 25 mg. capsules to P.C., a patient who did not have a prescription for that schedule IV-controlled substance, when he either verified the label on Prescription No. 0613015 as accurate when it was incorrect, or by failing to verify the label and prescription before CVS dispensed it.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

Failure to Adequately Counsel (Respondent Arbogast)

XXVII.

NRS 639.266 requires a pharmacist, on receipt of a prescription and after review of the patient's record, to communicate with the patient, or a person caring for the patient, matters that will enhance the patient's therapy through drugs. NAC 639.707(1) and (2) require that discussion to include, among other things, the name of the drug, dosage and administration instructions, the intended use of the drug, common side effects, and other information that is necessary for the safe and effective use of the drug. A pharmacist who performs those duties in an "incompetent, unskillful or negligent manner" is guilty of unprofessional conduct pursuant to NAC 639.945(1)(i).

Respondent Arbogast violated NRS 639.266, NAC 639.707(1) and (2) and engaged in unprofessional conduct and conduct contrary to the public interest as defined in NAC

639.945(1)(i) by failing to counsel P.C. regarding Prescription No. 0613015. That error, combined with other errors within the pharmacy, caused CVS to dispense thirty (30) chlordiazepoxide 25 mg. capsules to P.C., a patient who did not have a prescription for that schedule IV-controlled substance. For that conduct, Arbogast is subject to discipline pursuant to NRS 639.210(4) and (12), and NRS 639.255.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

Failure to Maintain and Produce Prescription Records (Respondent CVS #4691)

XXVIII.

NAC 639.910(1)(a) requires that "[a]ny computerized system used by a pharmacy for recording information concerning prescriptions must be designed in such a manner that it provides: (a) A readily retrievable printed record of the information relating to a prescription or a patient which the pharmacy is required to maintain pursuant to state or federal law, including, without limitation, information relating to the original prescription or the refill or modification of that prescription".

Additionally, NAC 639.485 states, in part:

- 1. A pharmacy shall maintain records for controlled substances:
 - (a) In a readily retrievable manner.
- (b) In a manner that establishes the receipt, distribution and destruction of all controlled substances handled by the pharmacy.
- 2. A pharmacy shall maintain a perpetual inventory of any controlled substance listed in schedule Π .
- 3. Records of the distribution of controlled substances listed in schedule II, schedule III or schedule IV must include:
 - (a) The name of the drug, dosage form and strength.
- (b) The name of the pharmacist distributing or authorizing the distribution of the controlled substance.
- (c) The name of the authorized person receiving the controlled substance. This information may be included on the record of administration.

- (d) The location to which the controlled substance is being distributed.
 - (e) Controlled substances returned to the pharmacy.
- (f) A record of any waste of any prepared or partially administered dose of a controlled substance, which must be witnessed and cosigned by another person who is licensed to provide medical care.

NAC 639.482 requires such records to be kept by a pharmacy for at least 2 years and made available for inspection and copying upon the request of the Board.

Nevada law also requires a pharmacy computer system to have adequate safeguards to identify whether information in the system concerning a prescription has been modified or manipulated, and, where information was modified or manipulated, identify the manner, date and person who modified or manipulated the information. See NAC 639.930(3), see also NAC 639.751(1)(b) and (2). Additionally, NAC 639.930(4) and (5) require the pharmacy's computer system to maintain the information identified per NAC 639.930(3) and to prevent the removal of that information and the record of a prescription once the system assigns a number to the prescription. Further, NAC 639.935(3)(g)(3) states that computer system must produce printed records of history of each modification or manipulation of information concerning the prescription.

Respondent CVS #4691 violated NAC 639.482, NAC 639.485 and/or NAC 639.910(1) by deleting and/or having a system that allowed its employee, Respondent Pasero, to delete the record, or a portion of the record, for Prescription No. 0613015, specifically by removing the original data and eliminating any reference of the filling error. In failing to maintain records for Prescription No. 0613015 in a readily retrievable manner, by failing to timely provide documents to Board Staff upon request, and in failing to maintain a recordkeeping system that would allow

for readily retrievable prescription records for Prescription No. 0613015, CVS #4691 violated NAC 639.751(1)(b) and (2), NAC 639.930(3), (4) and (5), and NAC 639.935(3)(g)(3). For that conduct, CVS #4691 is subject to discipline pursuant to NRS 639.210(12) and (17) and NRS 639.255.

FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION

Unprofessional Conduct (Respondent Pasero)

XXIX.

Nevada law requires a pharmacy to maintain and produce records in conformance with NAC 639.482, NAC 639.485 and NAC 639.910(1). NAC 639.945(1)(i) provides that "(p)erforming . . . duties as the holder of a license, certificate or registration issued by the Board . . . in an incompetent, unskillful or negligent manner" shall constitute unprofessional conduct and conduct that is contrary to the public interest. NAC 639.945(1)(m) provides that "(f)ailing to provide any document, data or information that is required to be made and maintained pursuant to chapters 453, 454, 585 and 639 of NRS and chapters 453, 454, 585 and 639 of NAC to a member of the Board or a member of the staff of the Board upon his or her request" shall constitute unprofessional conduct and conduct that is contrary to the public interest.

Respondent Pasero violated NAC 639.482, NAC 639.485 and NAC 639.910(1) by deleting the record, or a portion of the record, for Prescription No. 0613015, specifically by removing the original data and eliminating any reference of the filling error. Respondent Pasero's actions constitute unprofessional conduct as defined in NAC 639.945(1)(i) and (m). For that conduct, Respondent Pasero is subject to discipline pursuant to NRS 639.210(4) and (17) and/or NRS 639.255.

FIFTH CAUSE OF ACTION

Managing Pharmacist Responsibilities (Respondent Lee)

XXX.

NRS 639.0087 defines "managing pharmacist" as "a registered pharmacist who is responsible for the operation of a pharmacy." A managing pharmacist is responsible for the acts and omissions of pharmaceutical technicians and other personnel. NAC 639.702.

Additionally, "[t]he managing pharmacist of a pharmacy that uses a computerized system for recording information concerning prescriptions shall ensure that a procedure is conducted upon the computerized system that ensures that the information which is recorded in the system is not lost or destroyed." NAC 639.910(2). Whenever a managing pharmacist designates another pharmacist to assume the managing pharmacist's duties in his or her absence "[t]he managing pharmacist is responsible for the activities of the designee." NRS 639.220(3)(c).

The Board may suspend or revoke a registration pursuant to NRS 639.210(15) when a person has "as a managing pharmacist, violated any provision of law or regulation concerning recordkeeping or inventory in a store over which he or she presides, or has knowingly allowed a violation of any provision of this chapter or other state or federal laws or regulations relating to the practice of pharmacy by personnel of the pharmacy under his or her supervision."

As the managing pharmacist/pharmacist in charge of CVS #4691 at the time of each of the violations alleged above, Respondent Lee is responsible for those violations pursuant to NRS 639.210(15), NRS 639.220(3)(c), NAC 639.702 and NAC 639.910(2). Lee has also engaged in unprofessional conduct and conduct contrary to the public interest as defined in NAC

639.945(1)(m). Lee is therefore subject to discipline pursuant to NRS 639.210(4), (12), (15) and (17) and NRS 639.255.

SIXTH CAUSE OF ACTION

Pharmacy/Pharmacy Owner Responsibility (Respondent CVS #4691)

XXXI.

NRS 639.230(5) provides: "Any violation of any of the provisions of this chapter [NRS Chapter 639] by a managing pharmacist or by personnel of the pharmacy under the supervision of the managing pharmacist is cause for the suspension or revocation of the license of the pharmacy by the Board."

Additionally, "[t]he owner of a pharmacy, the managing pharmacist of the pharmacy and the registered pharmacist on duty at the pharmacy are responsible for the acts and omissions of pharmaceutical technicians and other personnel who are not pharmacists working in or for the pharmacy, including, but not limited to, any errors committed or unauthorized work performed by such personnel, if the owner, managing pharmacist or registered pharmacist knew or reasonably should have known of the act or omission." NAC 639.702.

Further, the owner of any business or facility licensed, certified or registered by the Board is responsible for the acts of all personnel in his or her employ. NAC 639.945(2).

As the pharmacy/pharmacy owner at which the violations of law alleged herein occurred, CVS #4691 is responsible for those violations, including those of Respondents Rojprasitpom, Arbogast, Pasero, and Lee pursuant to NRS 639.230(5), NAC 639.702 and NAC 639.945(2). CVS #4691 is therefore subject to discipline pursuant to NRS 639.210(4) and (12) and NRS 639.255.

XXXII.

For the errors, misconduct and violations alleged above in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Causes of Action, Respondents, and each of them, are subject to discipline pursuant NRS 639.210, as well as NRS 639.230(5) and/or NRS 639.255.

XXXIII.

WHEREFORE it is requested that the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy take appropriate disciplinary action with respect to the certificates of registration of these respondents.

- 2. On or about May 2, 2019, Board Staff properly served the Notice of Intended Action and Accusation (Accusation) on file in this matter on Respondent CVS.
 - 3. Respondent CVS filed an Answer to the Accusation on or about May 21, 2019.
- 4. Respondent CVS is fully aware of its right to seek the advice of counsel in this matter and obtained the advice of counsel prior to entering into this Stipulation.
- 5. Respondent CVS is aware of its right to a hearing on the matters alleged in the Accusation, its right to reconsideration, its right to appeal and any and all other rights which may be accorded to it pursuant to NRS Chapter 233B (Nevada Administrative Procedure Act), NRS Chapter 622A (Administrative Procedure Before Certain Regulatory Bodies), and NRS Chapter 639 (Nevada Pharmacy Act).
- 6. Conditioned on the acceptance of this Stipulation by the Board, and with the exception of the right to challenge any determination that Respondent CVS has failed to comply with the provisions of Paragraphs 9, 14 and/or 15 below, Respondent CVS hereby freely and

voluntarily waive its rights to a hearing, reconsideration, appeal and any and all other rights related to this action that may be accorded to it by NRS Chapter 233B (Nevada Administrative Procedure Act), NRS Chapter 622A (Administrative Procedure Before Certain Regulatory Bodies), and NRS Chapter 639 (Nevada Pharmacy Act).

- 7. Respondent CVS admits that evidence exists, and that Board staff prosecuting this case could present such evidence at an administrative hearing, which may be sufficient to establish a factual basis for the violations alleged in the Accusation, to wit, that:
- A. At the time of the events alleged in the Accusation, Gisela Ochoa (Ochoa), Certificate of Registration No. PT18361, and Jenifer Grove (Grove), Certificate of Registration No. PT11159, were both pharmaceutical technicians registered by the Board and employed by Respondent CVS #4691.
- B. Ochoa violated NAC 639.482, NAC 639.485 and NAC 639.910(1) and engaged in unprofessional conduct and conduct contrary to the public interest under NAC 639.945(1)(d) and (i) by dispensing a prescription drug to the wrong patient and performing the point of sale prescription scans and sales transaction under Grove's computer initials.
- C. Grove violated NAC 639.482, NAC 639.485 and NAC 639.910(1) and engaged in unprofessional conduct and conduct contrary to the public interest under NAC 639.945(1)(d) and (i) by failing to maintain the security of her password.
- D. As the pharmacy/pharmacy owner at which the violations of law alleged herein occurred, CVS #4691 is responsible for the violations committed by Ochoa and Grove pursuant to NRS 639.230(5) and NAC 639.945(2). CVS #4691 is therefore subject to discipline pursuant to NRS 639.210(4) and (12) and NRS 639.255, NAC 639.751 and NAC 639.930.
- 8. Those violations are plead with particularity in the Accusation, and are grounds for action pursuant to NRS 639.210 and NRS 639.255.

- Based upon the Accusation and the foregoing admissions, the Board and Respondent CVS stipulate to the following penalties. Respondent CVS Pharmacy #4691, Certificate of Registration No. PH02471, shall:
- A. Pay a fine of Five-Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) associated with the violations indicated above; and
- B. Pay Seven-Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) to partially reimburse the Board for reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred in investigating and prosecuting this matter.
- 10. Any failure by Respondent CVS to comply with the terms of this Order may result in issuance by the Executive Secretary of an order to show cause directing Respondent CVS to appear before the Board at the next regularly-scheduled meeting for a show cause hearing. If such a hearing results in a finding of a violation of this Order by Respondent CVS, the Board may impose additional discipline upon Respondent CVS not inconsistent with the provisions of NRS Chapter 639.
- 11. General Counsel will present this Stipulation to the Board for approval pursuant to NRS 622.330 at the Board's regularly scheduled public meeting on March 6, 2019, in Reno, Nevada. Respondent CVS's authorized representative(s) will appear at the meeting to answer questions from the Board Members and/or Board Staff. The Board Members and Staff may discuss and deliberate regarding this Stipulation, even if Respondent CVS or its counsel are not present at the meeting.
- 12. The Board has discretion to accept this Stipulation, but it is not obligated to do so.
 If this Stipulation is approved by the Board it shall be a public record pursuant to NRS 622.330.
- 13. If the Board rejects any part or all of this Stipulation, and unless they reach an alternative agreement on the record during the hearing, the parties agree that a full hearing on the merits of this matter may be heard by the Board. The terms and admissions herein may not be used or referred to in a full hearing on the merits of this matter.

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction over these matters.
- The Board properly served a Notice of Intended Action and Accusation (Accusation) on each of the Respondents on or about July 30, 2014.
- 3. Respondents filed a joint written Answer and Notice of Defense (Answer) with the Board on August 15, 2014.
- Respondents, and each of them, were fully aware of their right to seek the advice of counsel in this matter, and obtained the advice of counsel prior to entering into this Stipulation.
- 5. Respondents (Mr. Delallo and CVS Pharmacy #8779), and each of them, are fully aware of their right to a hearing on the matters alleged in the Accusation, their right to reconsideration, their right to appeal and any and all other rights which may be accorded to them pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act and the Nevada Pharmacy Act.

- 6. Conditioned on the Board's acceptance of this Stipulation, and with the exception of the right to challenge any determination that Respondents have failed to comply with the provisions of this Stipulation, Respondents, and each of them, hereby freely and voluntarily waive their rights to a hearing, reconsideration, appeal, and any and all other rights that may be accorded to them by the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act and the Nevada Pharmacy Act.
- Conditioned on the Board's acceptance of this Stipulation, Respondent CVS
 Pharmacy #8779 is dismissed from the First and Second Causes of Action.
- 8. With the exception of the allegations against CVS Pharmacy #8779 in the First and Second Causes of Action, Respondents, and each of them, admit that evidence exists, and that such evidence could be presented at a hearing, to establish a factual basis for the violations specified in Paragraph 9, below, to wit, that while employed by CVS Pharmacy #8779, Mr. Delallo (a) failed to strictly follow the instructions of patient S.H.'s physician by dispensing citalopram HBR 40 mg. tablets, rather than the prescribed ceftibuten 400 mg. tablets, (b) failed to adequately counsel regarding patient S.H.'s prescription for ceftibuten 400 mg. tablets, and (c) when providing the correct medication to S. H., edited the original fill record for prescription number 1133086, rather than creating a new prescription number for the correct medication.
- 9. Based on Respondents' admissions, Respondents admit that Mr. Delallo is guilty of violating:
- a. Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.945(1)(d) (First Cause of Action);
- Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 639.266(1) and NAC 639.707(1) and (2)
 (Second Cause of Action); and
 - c. NAC 639.945(1)(i) (Third Cause of Action), respectively.
- 10. Those violations are grounds for discipline against Mr. Delallo pursuant to NRS 639.210(4) and (12), as well as NRS 639.255.

- Based on Respondents' admissions, CVS Pharmacy #8779 is responsible for acts of its employee Mr. Delallo under NAC 639.945(2).¹
- 12. Based upon the Accusation and the foregoing admissions, Respondents individually stipulate to the following penalties, which will become binding and enforceable upon approval of this Stipulation by the Board:
- a. Mr. DeLallo shall (i) pay a fine of \$750.00 for the dispensing error, (ii) complete one additional hour of CE in the area of "error prevention", by taking a CE credit approved in advance by the Board Executive Secretary, (iii) pay a fine of \$750.00 for the counseling violation, (iv) complete any additional training program deemed appropriate by CVS, and (v) pay a \$45.00 administrative fee for fingerprinting.
- b. CVS Pharmacy #8779 shall (i) provide to Board Staff within sixty (60) days a letter which contains: a summary or outline of CVS's Policies and Procedures regarding "counseling", a summary or outline of the training procedures for CVS pharmacists; and a summary of the additional training which CVS required Mr. Delallo to complete as a result of the underlying facts of the Accusation and violations found herein, and (ii) pay an administrative fee of \$450.00. The adequacy of the training CVS requires Mr. Delallo to complete pursuant to this Stipulation is subject to review by Board Staff.
- 13. The foregoing is for the purposes of this proceeding only, and shall have no force or effect in any other case or proceeding before the Board.
- 14. Board Counsel will present this stipulation to the Board for approval at its meeting on September 3, 2014, in Reno, Nevada. Respondents, and each of them, will appear at that meeting to answer questions put to them by members of the Board and Board Staff. The Board may discuss and deliberate regarding this stipulation even if a Respondent or both of them are absent. Larry L. Pinson, in his official capacity as Executive Secretary of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, makes the following that will serve as both a notice of intended action under Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 233B.127(3), and as an accusation under NRS 639.241.

I.

The Nevada State Board of Pharmacy (Board) has jurisdiction over this matter because at the time of the events alleged herein, Respondent Joseph Delallo (Mr. Delallo), Certificate of Registration No. 18429, was a registered pharmacist with the Board, and Respondent CVS Pharmacy #8779 (CVS #8779), Certificate of Registration No. PH01613, was a pharmacy registered with the Board.

II.

On or about March 25, 2014, Dr. R treated patient SH and prescribed Cedax® (ceftibuten) 400 mg. with instructions to take 400 mg. every day for five days. SH tendered the prescription to CVS #8779 on March 25, 2014. SH's spouse picked up the filled prescription later that same day.

III.

On March 27, 2014, SH ingested one tablet as instructed on the prescription label

(prescription number 1133086). He soon developed a variety of symptoms including headache, excessive sweating, heart palpitations, dry mouth and diarrhea.

IV.

SH queried the internet and discovered that the tablets were not the antibiotic, ceftibuten (Cedax®), prescribed by his physician. He identified the dispensed tablets as the generic for Celexa® (citalopram), an antidepressant.

٧.

HS contacted CVS #8779. At Mr. Delallo's request, SH returned to the pharmacy on March 30, 2014, at which time Mr. Delallo exchanged the citalogram 400 mg. tablets for ceftibuten 180mg/5ml suspension.

VI.

Pharmaceutical technician Annette Smith initiated the processing of SH's prescription for ceftibuten 400 mg. on March 25, 2014. During data entry, Ms. Smith incorrectly entered citalogram HBR 40 mg. instead of the prescribed ceftibuten 400 mg.

VII.

Pharmaceutical technician Esai Rodriquez labeled and filled the prescription. Ms. Rodriquez did not detect the error.

VIII.

Mr. Delallo performed the final review and verification of the prescription. During verification, Mr. Delallo failed to detect that the prescription had been filled with citalopram HBR 40 mg. rather than the prescribed ceftibuten 400 mg.

IX.

During counseling, Mr. Delallo again failed to identify the error.

X.

During the Board investigation, attempts to locate a record of the original prescription (1133086) for citalogram HBR 40 mg. met with negative results. The original prescription could

not be located, and the original data entered into the pharmacy computer system on March 25, 2014, had been edited by Mr. Delallo to remove any reference to the citalopram error.

Prescription number 1133086 now reflects the data connected to the corrected ceftibuten fill of March 30, 2014. The investigation also revealed that Mr. Delallo disposed of the returned bottle of citalopram shortly after it was returned to the pharmacy.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

XI.

In failing to strictly follow the instructions of SH's physician by verifying and dispensing citalopram HBR 40 mg., rather than the ceftibuten 400 mg. that was prescribed, Respondents Joseph Delallo and CVS Pharmacy #8779 violated Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 639.945(1)(d) and/or (i), which violations are grounds for action pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 639.210(4), (11) and/or (12), or alternatively under NRS 639.255.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

XII.

By failing to detect during counseling that the prescription was filled with citalopram HBR 40 mg., rather than the ceftibuten 400 mg. that was prescribed, Mr. Delallo and CVS Pharmacy #8779 provided inadequate counseling in violation of NRS 639.266(1) and NAC 639.707(1) and (2), as well as NRS 639.945(1)(i), which violations are grounds for action pursuant to NRS 639.210(4) and (12), or alternatively under NRS 639.255.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

XIII.

In removing the original fill record for prescription number 1133086, Joseph Delallo violated NAC 639.910(1) and (2) and/or NAC 639.945(1)(h) and (i), which violations are grounds for action pursuant to NRS 639.210(4), (11), (12) and/or (15), or alternatively under NRS 639.255.

FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION

XIV.

As the owner of the pharmacy in which the foregoing violations, or any one of them, occurred, Respondent CVS Pharmacy #8779 is responsible and therefore subject to discipline pursuant to NAC 639.945(1)(d) and (i) and/or (2), as well as NAC 639.910(1)(m) and (2), which violations are grounds for action pursuant to NRS 639.210(4), (11) and/or (12), or alternatively under NRS 639.255.

WHEREFORE it is requested that the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy take appropriate disciplinary action with respect to the certificates of registration of these respondents.
