5. Disciplinary hearings pursuant to NRS 639.247. **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

I. Mashayla Coleman

(23-505-PT-S)

No one was present on behalf of the Mashayla Coleman.

Jade Jacobo disclosed that Respondent Coleman was a former CVS employee, but she can participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case alleging that Respondent Coleman diverted controlled substances, 863 Alprazolam and 2,057mg of promethazine with codeine syrup.

Ms. Tucker requested that the Declaration of Darlene Nases, Board Coordinator for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, be entered into the record as Exhibit A, which included Exhibits 1-3.

President Park admitted Exhibit A and Exhibits 1-3 into the record.

Board discussion ensued.

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to find that Respondent Coleman was properly served and noticed of the hearing.

Respondent Coleman fined \$1,000 for the violations and to award \$638.97 in attorney's costs and fees on the basis that they were reasonable, necessary, and actually incurred.

Jeffrey Lang, Robert Seik, and Joey Gilbert, Esq. were present.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case alleging that as pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Partell, is responsible for the acts of its employee in Case No. 23-175-PH-S who refused to transfer a prescription at the request of the patient. Partell is responsible for the acts of its employees in Case No. 23-239-PH-S who purchased drug substances from an unlicensed wholesaler in Nevada; dispensed several drug products to patients with directions to compound the drugs themselves; and furnished a patient's practitioner with prescription blanks bearing the name of the pharmacy. Partell is responsible for the acts of its employees in Case No. 23-429-PH-S who dispensed 512 invalid prescriptions issued for "Emergency Kits" or "COVID Kits" for which the drugs in each were not

identified on the prescription and dispensed and substituted a different drug without permission in the "COVID Kits". Partell is responsible for the acts of its employees in Case No. 24-424-RPH-S who accepted, processed, and dispensed prescriptions that were not valid and those of which were controlled substance prescription were not transmitted electronically as required by Nevada Law.

Mr. Zunino prosecuted the case alleging that as pharmacy owner and managing pharmacist during the times of the events, Respondent Seik is responsible for the acts of its employees in Case No. 23-429-PH-S who dispensed 512 invalid prescriptions issued for "Emergency Kits" or "COVID Kits" for which the drugs in each were not identified on the prescription and dispensed and substituted a different drug without permission in the "COVID Kits". Respondent Seik is responsible for the acts of its employees in Case No. 24-424-RPH-S who accepted, processed, and dispensed prescriptions that were not valid and those of which were controlled substance prescription were not transmitted electronically as required by Nevada Law.

Mr. Zunino prosecuted the case alleging that as managing pharmacist during the times of the events, Respondent Lang is responsible for the acts of its employees who purchased drug substances from an unlicensed wholesaler in Nevada; dispensed several drug products to patients with directions to compound the drugs themselves; and furnished a patient's practitioner with prescription blanks bearing the name of the pharmacy.

Mr. Zunino presented proposed stipulations for each Respondent in the cases.

Board discussion ensued.

The amended proposed stipulated penalties for Partell Specialty Pharmacy, License No. PH02028, are the following: Respondent's license shall be revoked effective December 31, 2025. Prior to the revocation, Partell's License No. PH02028 shall be placed on probation, effective immediately, and subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$10,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$3,000 in attorney's fees and costs; 4) Respondent shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations concerning dangerous drugs and controlled substances and shall have no additional charges filed against it during the period of probation; and 4) Respondent shall submit to monthly inspections at owner's expense during the probation period.

The amended proposed stipulated penalties for Robert Seik, Certificate of Registration No. 13574, are the following: Respondent's registration shall be revoked effective August 1, 2025. The revocation shall be stayed and is placed on probation for a period of five (5) years subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$10,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs; 3) On or before December 31, 2025, Respondent Seik shall complete twelve (12) additional hours of continuing education (CE) on pharmacy law and ethics; 4) On or after August 1, 2025, and through the end of probation, Respondent Seik shall not work as a managing pharmacist for any pharmacy licensed by the Board; 5) On and after December 31,

2025, Respondent Seik shall not hold an ownership in any pharmacy licensed by the Board; 6) On and after the entry of this Stipulation through the end of the period of probation, Respondent Seik shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations concerning controlled substances and dangerous drugs and shall have no additional charges filed against him; and 7) On and after the entry of this Stipulation through the end of the period of probation, Respondent Seik shall not engage in the practice of compounding drug products.

The amended proposed stipulated penalties for Jeffrey Lang's, Certificate of Registration No. 17503, are the following: Respondent Lang's registration shall be revoked, effective immediately. The revocation shall be stayed and is placed on probation for a period of five (5) years subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$10,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs; 3) On or before December 31, 2025, Respondent Lang shall complete twelve (12) additional hours of continuing education (CE) on pharmacy law and ethics; 4) During the period of probation, Respondent Lang shall not work as a managing pharmacy for or hold an ownership in any pharmacy licensed by the Board other than EliteRx (License No. PH04615); 5) Respondent Lang shall comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations concerning controlled substances and dangerous drugs and have no additional charges filed against him during the probation; and 6) Respondent Lang shall not engage in the practice of compounding "sterile compounded drug products" for a period of two (2) years after the approval of the Stipulation.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case alleging that Respondent Brogan failed to complete his 2019 and 2021 continuing education hours as required by Nevada Law.

The amended proposed stipulated penalties for Michael Brogan's, Certificate of Registration No. 18710, are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 18710 is placed on probation until July 18, 2025; 2) Respondent Brogan must produce proof of two and one-half (2.5) continuing education credits and one (1) law continuing education credit. If Respondent fails to provide proof, his Certificate of Registration No. 18710 will be suspended for a period of time not to exceed five (5) months; any suspension will be lifted upon proof of his completed required continuing education credit; 3) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; and 4) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case alleging that Respondent DeShazo entered a Settlement Agreement with the Osteopathic Board's Case No. PN1407002 and voluntarily surrendered his license.

Ms. Tucker requested that the settlement agreement be entered into the record as Exhibit 1.

President Park admitted the settlement agreement into record as Exhibit 1.

Board discussion ensued.

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to find the Findings of Facts and Conclusions of Law consistent with paragraphs 1-12 of the accusation.

6. Appeal hearing pursuant to NRS 639.2895(2) **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

A. FutureCare

No one was present on behalf of FutureCare.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case alleging that Julio Orozco, owner of FutureCare, was issued a citation and fine by the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, which Mr. Orozco appealed.

Mr. Orozco sent an email to Board staff saying that he would not be attending the hearing.

Kenneth Scheuber, Investigator for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, was called as a witness.

Kenneth Scheuber appeared and was sworn in by President Park.

The Board heard testimony and received evidence.

Mr. Zunino requested that the email correspondence from Mr. Orozco and Mr. Scheuber to be admitted as Exhibit 6.

President Park admitted Exhibit 6 into the record.

Board discussion ensued.

Board Action:

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to find that the Respondent was properly noticed of the hearing; Moved to make the Findings of Facts consistent with paragraphs 1-17 of the accusation; moved to make Conclusions of Law consistent with paragraphs 18-27 of the accusation; moved to find FutureCare guilty of Counts One in paragraphs 28-33; and to impose a fine of \$1,000 to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the Order.

7. Discussion and possible action to approve Amended Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order in Case No. 19-012-CS-S, in settlement of Petition for Judicial Review filed in *Festus Ebonka, APRN, Petitioner v. Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, Respondent*, Eighth Judicial District Court Case No. A-24-902608-J. **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for Nevada Board of Pharmacy, originally prosecuted the case against Festus Ebonka and gave a brief background on the previous Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order entered September 4, 2024, imposing discipline including a stay revocation against Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS23430n.

Mr. Ebonka subsequently filed a Petition for Judicial Review of the Board's Order, but has proposed to dismiss the PJR if the Board would amend the Order to vacate the revocation and instead impose a stayed suspension for the remainder of the probation period, until September 4, 2027.
