Hi,

I just noticed an email that I received from Gerber Medical Clinic regarding homeopathic/integrative medical care. Looks like you already held a meeting to restrict prescribed medications, but I wanted to share my experience there. I received care from Dr. Gerber many years ago (around 2009-2012). My experience was not positive whatsoever. Dr. Gerber prescribed multiple medications/supplements without proper testing/blood work that caused numerous side effects. He prescribed me similar medications/supplements that a friend of mine was also prescribed even though we had different health issues. Long story short, I felt completely awful, could barely function, spent thousands of dollars, and did not receive proper care. I thought going the homeopathic/alternative medicine route would be a better option but it was the complete opposite. I believe that there should be restrictions on his ability to prescribe medications/supplements and he should be required to complete comprehensive, evidence based-medical testing to prove need for a specific treatment plan. His approach seems to be completely unethical. He took years of a healthy quality of life from me and I would not recommend anyone to receive "care" from him. 
