Sothy Him and William Stilling, Esq. (counsel) were present.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Walgreens Pharmacy #03842 alleging that Walgreens Pharmacy #03842 is responsible for the acts of its employee, Respondent Him, who made an error in a prescription that resulted in a negative outcome to the patient.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Walgreens Pharmacy #03842, License No. PH01249, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order.

Ms. Tucker prosecuted the case against Sothy Him alleging that Respondent Him made an error in a prescription that resulted in a negative outcome to the patient.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Sothy Him, Certificate of Registration No. 15426, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order.

President Park disclosed that she was familiar with Oleg Bederman but could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Brian Convery (Representative for CVS Pharmacy #6867) and Oleg Bederman were present.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against CVS Pharmacy #6867 alleging that CVS Pharmacy #6867 is responsible for the acts of its employees who administered the COVID-19 vaccine in error to a patient who had not consented to be vaccinated.

The proposed stipulated penalties for CVS Pharmacy #6867, License No. PH01976, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before January 31, 2026.

Mr. Zunino prosecuted the case against Oleg Bederman alleging that Respondent Bederman administered a COVID-19 vaccine in error to a patient who had not consented to be vaccinated.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Oleg Bederman, Certificate of Registration No. 20591, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before June 30, 2026.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against CVS Pharmacy #6625 alleging that CVS Pharmacy #6625 is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription that resulted in a negative outcome to the patient.

Mr. Kandt disclosed that Respondent Victoreea Harris is deceased and all charges against her will be dismissed in the proposed stipulated settlement of this case.

The proposed stipulated penalties for CVS Pharmacy #6625, License No. PH02556, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,500 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before January 2, 2026.

Brian Convery, Representative for CVS Pharmacy, and Melanie Thomas, counsel for Sarah Pascual, were present.

President Park disclosed that she was familiar with Sarah Pascual but could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against CVS Pharmacy #8787 alleging that CVS Pharmacy #8787 is responsible for the acts of its managing pharmacist who induced an employee to perform pharmaceutical technician duties without a registration.

The proposed stipulated penalties for CVS Pharmacy #8787, License No. PH01144, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before January 2, 2026.

Mr. Kandt prosecuted the case against Sarah Pascual alleging that Respondent Pascual as managing pharmacist of CVS Pharmacy #8787 induced an employee to perform pharmaceutical technician duties without a registration.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Sarah Pascual, Certificate of Registration No. 20433, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 20433 is suspended for a period of two (2) years. The suspension is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before April 1, 2026; 3) Respondent shall complete two (2) additional continuing education credits on ethics and two (2) additional continuing education credits on duties of a managing pharmacist and shall provide certificates demonstrating completion; and 4) Other than her current position as managing pharmacist at Walgreens Pharmacy #11668, Respondent Pascual shall not work as a managing pharmacist of any pharmacy licensed by the Board while on probation without prior approval from the Board.

Brian Convery (Representative for CVS Pharmacy) and Joseph Delallo were present.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against CVS Pharmacy #9981 alleging that CVS Pharmacy #8787 is responsible for the acts of its employees who dispensed an expired prescription to a patient.

The proposed stipulated penalties for CVS Pharmacy #9981, License No. PH01300, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent

assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before January 5, 2026.

Ms. Tucker prosecuted the case against Joseph Delallo alleging that Respondent Delallo dispensed an expired prescription to a patient.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Joseph Delallo, Certificate of Registration No. 18429, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 18429 is revoked for a period of three (3) years. The revocation is stayed and is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; Respondent shall remit payment in two equal payments: \$2,500 due within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, and the remaining \$2,500 due within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this order; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order.

Board discussion ensued.

The proposed amended stipulated penalties for Joseph Delallo, Certificate of Registration No. 18429, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 18429 is suspended for a period of three (3) years. The revocation is stayed and is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent cannot be a managing pharmacist for any pharmacy licensed by the Board during his probation period. Respondent shall have sixty (60) days to discontinue employment as managing pharmacist to allow Respondent's current employer time to find a replacement; 2) Respondent shall complete ten (10) additional hours of continuing education related to error prevention within 180 days of the Stipulation; 3) Respondent fined \$4,000 for the violations; Respondent shall remit payment in two equal payments: \$2,000 due within 90 days of the effective date of this order, and the remaining \$2,000 due within 180 days of the effective date of this Stipulation; 4) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, due within 90 days of this Stipulation; and 5) Respondent shall not engage in conduct for which disciplinary action may be imposed during probation period.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Express Scripts alleging that Express Scripts is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription and allowed personnel not registered in Nevada to perform tasks necessary for filling and dispensing the prescription.

Respondent permitted administration of

patient-specific prescription medications to multiple patients and failed to properly label, segregate, and/or dispose of adulterated and/or dangerous drugs. Lastly, Respondent issued prescriptions for dangerous drugs to Meta Pharmacy Services falsely identifying the patient in the order to obtain those drugs for office administration.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Daniel Inglish, Certificate of Registration No. CS22888, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS22888 is suspended for a period of one (1) year. The suspension is stayed and is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before December 3, 2026; and 3) Respondent shall comply with all federal and statutes and regulations regarding controlled substances and dangerous drugs, and have no additional charges filed against him while on probation.

Due to revocation of his License No. 10883 to practice medicine Respondent no longer qualifies as a practitioner for registration to dispense controlled substances.

As part of the stipulated settlement, the allegation of issuing a prescription on a suspended controlled substance registration will be withdrawn and all related counts dismissed.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Abdollah Assad, Certificate of Registration No. CS12432, are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS12432 is revoked; 2) Respondent may not possess (except pursuant to a lawful order of a practitioner), administer, prescribe or dispense a controlled substance until he has petitioned the Board for reinstatement, and the Board reinstates his certificate of registration 3) Respondent may not petition for reinstatement for a period of two (2)

years from the effective date of the Order; 4) If Respondent applies for reinstatement, he must appear before the Board to answer questions and give testimony on his application; 5) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 6) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before February 2, 2026.
