5. Disciplinary hearings pursuant to NRS 639.247. **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

AA. Walgreens Pharmacy #03842 (24-451-PH-S)

William Stilling, Esq., was present on behalf of Walgreens Pharmacy #03842.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Walgreens Pharmacy #03842 alleging that as the pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Walgreen's Pharmacy #03842 is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription that resulted in a negative outcome to the patient.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Walgreens Pharmacy #03842, License No. PH01249, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order; 3) Respondent will ensure that all pharmacies in Nevada that use automated filling cells require pharmacists to review the SOPs for filling automated cells with medications from stock bottle and will provide documentation to Board staff within sixty (60) days of the effective date of the Order; and 4) Respondent will cease using the Yuyama EV-1 automated filling cells as of January 31, 2026.

Ms. Tucker requested to amend paragraph 8, section D of the Order to read "January 31, 2026" instead of "January 31, 2025", as well as paragraph 10 to read "January 14, 2026" instead of "December 3, 2025".

Board discussion ensued.

N. David Whitehouse (23-429-RPH-B-S)

David Whitehouse was present.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Mr. Whitehouse, alleging that, as managing pharmacist during the time of the events, Respondent Whitehouse is responsible for the acts of its employees at Partell Pharmacy who dispensed invalid “Emergency Kits” or “COVID Kits” for which the drugs in each kit were not identified on the prescription, and they would substitute Budesonide in the “COVID Kit” with a Medrol DosePak and Albuterol without the knowledge or consent of the prescribing practitioner.

The proposed stipulated penalties for David Whitehouse, Certificate of Registration No. 13635, are the following: 1) Respondent’s Certificate of Registration No. 13635 has been forfeited because Respondent failed to renew it; 2) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney’s fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before February 28, 2026.

Mr. Zunino requested to amend paragraph 8, section D of the Order to read “February 28, 2026” instead of “February 28, 2025”.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against CVS Pharmacy #8824 alleging that as the pharmacy/pharmacy owner, CVS

Pharmacy #8824 is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription that resulted in negative outcome to the patient.

Mr. Kandt prosecuted the case against Karlo Arceo alleging that Respondent Arceo made an error in a prescription that resulted in negative outcome to the patient.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Karlo Arceo, Certificate of Registration No. 19697, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 19697 is suspended for a period of one (1) year. The suspension is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by February 1, 2026.

The proposed stipulated penalties for CVS Pharmacy #8824, License No. PH00947, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$10,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due by February 1, 2026.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Rodelyn Arceo alleging that Respondent Arceo allowed non-practitioners to independently access, possess, furnish, and administer dangerous drugs without direct practitioner supervision.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Rodelyn Arceo, Certificate of Registration No. CS30228, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS30228 is suspended for a period of one (1) year. The suspension is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by July 3, 2026.

H. Gregory Allen Oliver (24-224-CS-S)

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Gregory Allen Oliver alleging that Respondent Oliver dispensed controlled substances without a valid dispensing practitioner registration and failed to review the PMP.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Gregory Allen Oliver, Certificate of Registration No. CS35044, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS35044 is suspended for a period of one (1) year. The suspension is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by July 3, 2026.

Chi Vu and Andrew Joseph Liu (Regional Pharmacy Supervisor for Costco) were present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Costco Pharmacy #673 alleging that as the pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Costco

Pharmacy #673 is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription.

Mr. Kandt prosecuted the case against Chi Vu alleging that Respondent Vu made an error in a prescription.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Chi Vu, Certificate of Registration No. 18811, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by April 1, 2026.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Costco Pharmacy #673, Pharmacy License No. PH00825, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by April 1, 2026.

Forrest Zimmerman, Esq., was present on behalf of Danny Young.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Danny Young alleging that Respondent Young allowed a non-practitioner to independently access, possess, furnish, and administer dangerous drugs without direct practitioner supervision.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Danny Young, Certificate of Registration No. CS06454, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS06454 is placed on probation for a period of one (1) year, subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by February 27, 2026.

U. Robert Milne (23-418-CS-S)

Chris R. McCullough, Esq., was present on behalf of Robert Milne.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Robert Milne alleging that Respondent Milne dispensed dangerous drugs without a dispensing registration; held for sale an adulterated drug; failed to produce complete and accurate records of all dangerous drugs dispensed to patients; failed to store and/or possess dangerous drugs from patients and employees that were not in stock containers properly labeled and procured from a manufacturer, wholesaler or pharmacy; and did not acquire the dangerous drugs from patients and employees pursuant to a prescription written by himself or another practitioner, and/or were not dispensed to Respondent by a pharmacy or dispensing practitioner.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Robert Milne, Certificate of Registration No. CS03445, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order.

Board discussion ensued.

Motion: President Park moved to approve the Stipulation and Order for Robert Milne as presented by Ms. Tucker.

Action: Passed unanimously.

M. Aaron Webb (24-505-RPH-O)

Aaron Webb and Mark Armstrong (counsel) were present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Aaron Webb for reciprocal disciplinary action on Certificate of Registration No. 22724 based upon disciplinary action by the Arizona Board of Pharmacy for diversion.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Aaron Webb, Certificate of Registration No. 22724, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 22724 is placed on probation until October 29, 2029, and subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent must fully comply with the consent agreement with Arizona State Board of Pharmacy's Case No. 24-0394; and 2) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations, due and payable by February 27, 2026.

Board discussion ensued.

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to approve the Stipulation and Order for Aaron Webb as presented by Mr. Kandt.

Second: Adam Porath

Action: Passed unanimously.

R. Saman Sazegar (25-420-RPH-S)

Saman Sazegar was present.

President Park disclosed that she is familiar with Saman Sazegar from Roseman University, but she could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Saman Sazegar alleging that Respondent Sazegar was arrested for a DUI and was under the influence of alcohol and Diazepam, a controlled substance. He did not have a valid U.S. prescription as he obtained the medication from a prescription issued by a licensed physician in Thailand. Respondent was disciplined by the California BOP.

Respondent Sazegar has fully satisfied the conditions imposed by the California State Board of Pharmacy.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Saman Sazegar, Certificate of Registration No. 20754, are the following: 1) Respondent accepts the Order as public reprimand for having possessed diazepam without a prescription and having violated federal law related to the importation of prescription drugs; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, to be due and payable on or before February 28, 2026.

Board discussion ensued.

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to approve the Stipulation and Order for Saman

Sazegar, with the amendment to the date in the Decision and Order to read “2026” instead of “2025”, as presented by Mr. Zunino.

Second: Chanyis Taylor

Joey Gilbert, Esq., was present on behalf of Sunrise Pharmacy and Tamara Angeles.

President Park disclosed that she was familiar with Tamara Angeles from her time at Roseman University, but she could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Sunrise Pharmacy alleging that as the pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Sunrise Pharmacy is responsible for the acts of its employees who mailed dangerous drugs to California, Louisiana, Ohio, Texas, and Wisconsin when they did not hold a pharmacy, wholesaler, or mail-order pharmacy license in those states.

Ms. Tucker prosecuted the case against Tamara Angeles, alleging that, as managing pharmacist during the time of the events, Respondent Angeles was aware and is responsible for the acts of its employees who mailed dangerous drugs to California, Louisiana, Ohio, Texas, and Wisconsin when they did not hold a pharmacy, wholesaler, or mail-order pharmacy license in those states.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Sunrise Pharmacy, License No. PH03880, are the following: 1) Respondent’s Pharmacy License No. PH03880 has been forfeited because Respondent failed to renew it; 2) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney’s fees and costs, both to be due and payable on or before February 28, 2026.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Tamara Angeles, Certificate of Registration No.19070, are the following: Respondent’s Certificate of Registration No. 19070 is revoked for a period of one (1) year. The revocation is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney’s fees and costs; and 3) Respondent shall complete two (2) continuing education hours on duties of a managing pharmacist, in addition to the continuing education hours needed to maintain licensure, and provide certificates of completion to Board staff by July 1, 2026.

Board discussion ensued.

Board Action:

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to approve the Stipulation and Orders for Sunrise Pharmacy and Tamara Angeles as presented by Ms. Tucker.

Second: Krystal Freitas

Action: Passed unanimously.

V. Eric Welling

(24-078-CS-S)

Eric Welling was present.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Eric Welling alleging that Respondent Welling failed to disclose on his 2022 controlled substance application renewal that he had been subject to disciplinary action before numerous state boards of medicine.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Eric Welling, Certificate of Registration No. CS33340, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violation, and 2) Respondent to remain in treatment and counseling as recommended and provide reports to the Board during the duration of his treatment.

Ms. Tucker stated that Respondent Welling has since completed his treatment and counseling and will no longer need to provide PRN-PRN or equivalent evaluations to the Board as part of the stipulation.

Mr. Welling requested the Board that his license be placed in an "inactive" status and that the fine be waived to be paid until he decides whether or not to renew his license.

Todd Weiss, Senior Deputy Attorney General, advised that including such language in the Stipulation and Order is not standard practice.

Board discussion ensued.

Board Action:

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to approve the Stipulation and Order for Eric Welling as presented by Ms. Tucker, with the amendment to paragraph 7, section A to reflect that the fine be due by October 31, 2026, instead of June 3, 2026.

Second: Adam Porath

Action: Passed unanimously.

7. Discussion and possible action on Respondent Gary Royce Wisner, MD's Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to NRS 622A.390(1)(b) in Case No. 22-423-CS-N **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

Gary Royce Wisner and Jessica R. Gandy (counsel) were present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, stated that the Board entered a default order on April 12, 2023, against Respondent Wisner, who was convicted in June 2022 in California on ten (10) felony counts of health care insurance fraud. The Respondent no longer qualifies for a controlled substance registration and his Certificate of Registration No. CS28822 was revoked.

Ms. Gandy stated that Respondent Wisner was unable to attend the initial hearing against his license due to being incarcerated. Respondent Wisner is seeking reconsideration of the revocation order after regaining his license to practice medicine from the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners.

Mr. Kandt stated his opposition to the motion.

Ms. Gandy stated reasoning why Respondent Wisner was asking for reconsideration and gave background to the Board on how Respondent Wisner is currently serving rural communities.

Todd Weiss, Senior Deputy Attorney General, stated that the Board should first vote on whether or not to open this case up to a hearing before making a final motion.

Ms. Gandy clarified and requested that the Board reconsider the five (5) year period before Dr. Wisner may petition for reinstatement..

Board discussion ensued.

Board Action:

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to modify the disciplinary order for Dr. Wisner to state thirty (30) months instead of five (5) years before Dr. Wisner may petition for reinstatement for his controlled substance registration, with the addition that Dr. Wisner does not need to appear before the Board to petition for reinstatement of his registration, provided that his disclosures match his past discipline, and no other concerns are identified by Board staff.

Second: Richard Tomasso

Action: Passed unanimously.

5. Disciplinary hearings pursuant to NRS 639.247. **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

Steven Karen, counsel, was present on behalf of Christopher Lipana.
