Laura Tucker, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, had no objections.

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Matthew Apel and Janet Jensen, Esq., were present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Matthew Apel, alleging that Respondent Apel committed numerous violations related to maintaining an inventory of controlled substances as a dispensing practitioner.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Matthew Apel, Certificate of Registration Nos. CS24505 and PD00589 are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. PD00589 is revoked, effective immediately. Respondent cannot petition for reinstatement for a period of five (5) years from the effective date of the Order; 2) Certificate of Registration No. CS24505 is suspended, however, the suspension is stayed. Respondent is placed on probation for a period of two (2) years from the effective date of the Order; 3) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 4) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by August 14, 2026.

C. Marika Lenee Kerr

Marika Kerr was present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Marika Kerr, alleging that Respondent Kerr allowed an unlicensed person to use her credentials to purchase and maintain an unsecured inventory of dangerous drugs, to independently access, possess, furnish and administer dangerous drugs to patients without direct practitioner supervision, and to issue false prescriptions to obtain drugs for office administration.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Marika Kerr, Certificate of Registration No. CS26747 are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS26747 is suspended, however, the suspension is stayed. Respondent is placed on probation for a period of two (2) years from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by July 14, 2027.

Irene Benliro, Joshua Dickey, Esq., Joanne Mosqueda, and David Merill, Esq. were present.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Irene Benliro, alleging that Respondent Benliro failed to maintain proper security of the dangerous drugs in her possession and improperly comingled expired and unexpired substances in the storage area used to withdraw drugs for administration or dispensing to patients. She failed to maintain dispensing records as required by Nevada law. In addition, Respondent obtained non-FDA-approved drugs (retatrutide) from wholesalers or manufacturers that were not licensed by the Board to sell or distribute drugs at wholesale. Respondent dispensed drugs (retatrutide) that have not yet been approved for distribution or use in the United States.

Ms. Tucker prosecuted the case against Joanne Mosqueda, alleging that Respondent Mosqueda failed to maintain dispensing records as required by Nevada law. Respondent dispensed drugs (retatrutide) that have not yet been approved for distribution or use in the United States.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Irene Benliro, Certificate of Registration Nos. CS17652 and PD01110 are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. PD01110 is revoked, effective immediately. Respondent cannot petition for reinstatement for a period of five (5) years from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent may not be in possession of controlled substances or dangerous drugs at any place of practice for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of this Order unless Respondent is employed at a medical facility as defined by Nevada law, excluding mobile units. Respondent may work at a facility where the drugs maintained are to be used and administered in case of emergency and may be in possession of controlled substances or dangerous drugs if the drugs are prescribed to Respondent for a legitimate medical purpose. Respondent may continue to prescribe controlled substances and dangerous drugs pursuant to her Certificate of Registration No. CS17652, including during this one (1) year period; 3) Respondent fined \$10,000 for the violations; and 4) Respondent assessed \$1,681.50 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Joanne Mosqueda, Certificate of Registration Nos. CS24366 and PD27887 are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. PD27887 is revoked, effective immediately. Respondent cannot petition for reinstatement for a period of five (5) years from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent may not be in possession of controlled substances or dangerous drugs at any place of practice for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of this Order unless Respondent is employed at a medical facility as defined by Nevada law, excluding mobile units. Respondent may work at a facility where the drugs maintained are to be used and administered in case of emergency and may be in possession of controlled substances or dangerous drugs if the drugs are prescribed to Respondent for a legitimate medical purpose. Respondent may continue to prescribe controlled substances and dangerous drugs pursuant to her Certificate of Registration No. CS17652, including during this one (1) year period; 3) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 4) Respondent assessed \$1,681.50 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order.

7. Rehearing of Decision of the Board (NRS 639.252) **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

A. Darlene Hess (24-460-PTT-S)

Darlene Hess and Melissa Shake were present.

Jade Jacobo disclosed that she is now an employee of Walgreens Pharmacy, but she could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

David Wuest, Executive Secretary of the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, stated that he approved the Respondent's request for a rehearing of the case.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Darlene Hess, which resulted in a default judgment by order entered on June 3, 2026, holding that Respondent Hess failed to disclose criminal history on her 2014 pharmaceutical technician in training application and subsequently on all her biennial renewal applications through 2022.

Ms. Hess testified on the basis for her nondisclosure and failure to appear.

Mr. Kandt gave his recommendations of a modified Stipulation and Order.

Board discussion ensued.

Board Action:

Motion: President Park moved to modify the June 3, 2026, Order for Darlene Hess. Respondent Hess' Certificate of Registration No. PT27744 is revoked; however, the revocation is stayed. Respondent is placed on probation for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of the Order subject to the following condition: 1) Respondent to pay \$1,261.84 in attorney's fees and costs, due and payable by July 2027.

G. Ibrahim Fakhouri

H. Nirav Gandhi

Maria Nutile, Esq., Ibrahim Fakhouri, and Nirav Gandhi were present.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Ibrahim Fakhouri, alleging that Respondent Fakhouri dispensed dangerous drugs without the dispensing practitioner registration required under Nevada law. He improperly stored medications and syringes without labels and failed to maintain accurate records for all dangerous drugs he dispensed. Additionally, Respondent administered dangerous drugs (retatrutide and cagrilintide) that have not been approved for distribution or use in the United States and acquired dangerous drugs from wholesalers/manufacturers who were not licensed by the Board to sell or distribute drugs at wholesale.

Ms. Tucker prosecuted the case against Nirav Gandhi, alleging that Respondent Gandhi administered dangerous drugs (retatrutide and cagrilintide) that have not been approved for distribution or use in the United States.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Ibrahim Fakhouri, Certificate of Registration No. CS19540 are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS19540 is suspended; however, the suspension is stayed. Respondent is placed on probation for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent fined \$10,000 for the violations; and 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Nirav Gandhi, Certificate of Registration No. CS14653, are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS14653 is suspended; however, the suspension is stayed. Respondent is placed on probation for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent fined \$5,000

for the violations; and 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order.

Board discussion ensued.

(counsel for Total Infusion Care, Inc. and Mohammad Pourteymaur), Mohammad Pourteymaur, Jonathan Chan (new managing pharmacist), Kimberly Moore (Senior Vice President of Pharmacy Operations for Lux Infusion), and Morgan Harber, Esq. (Chief Administrator Officer and General Counsel for Lux Infusion) were present.

President Park disclosed that she was familiar with Jonathan Chan, but she could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Total Infusion Care, Inc., alleging that as pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Total Infusion Care is responsible for the actions of its employees who failed to comply with state laws and regulations governing the operation of the pharmacy.

Ms. Tucker prosecuted the case against Mohammad Pourteymaur, alleging that as managing pharmacist during the time of the events, Respondent Pourteymaur is responsible for the operation of the pharmacy which was not in compliance with Nevada state laws and regulations.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Total Infusion Care, License No. PH02936 are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of this Order; and 3) Board inspectors shall conduct quarterly inspections at the owner's expense for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of the Order.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Mohammad Pourteymaur, Certificate of Registration No. 13759 are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of this order.

Board discussion ensued.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against David McCleve, alleging that by the revocation of respondent's Nevada license to practice medicine, Respondent no longer qualifies as a practitioner for registration to dispense controlled substances under federal or state law.

Mr. Kandt requested that the declarations of service by Board staff showing that Respondent McCleve received proper notice of the charges and of the hearing be entered into the record.

President Park entered the declaration of service by Erin Miller as Exhibit A, and the declaration of service by Jessette Phaynarikone as Exhibit B.

Mr. Kandt requested the Board make Findings of Fact consistent with paragraphs 1-3 of the Accusation.

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to make Findings of Fact consistent with paragraphs 1-3 of the Accusation.

Mr. Kandt requested the Board make Conclusions of Law consistent with paragraphs 4-11 of the Accusation, and to find Respondent guilty on Counts One-Three.

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to make Conclusions of Law consistent with paragraphs 4-11 of the Accusation, and to find Respondent guilty on

Counts One-Three.

Mr. Kandt requested that the Board find that Respondent was properly noticed of the charges and the hearing in conformance with Nevada law.

Mr. Kandt provided a memorandum of attorney's fees and costs, in the amount of \$331.65, and requested it be entered into the record.

President Park entered the memorandum of attorney's fees and costs into the record as Exhibit C.

Mr. Kandt requested the Board to revoke Certificate of Registration No. CS22331 and with Respondent allowed to petition for reinstatement after a period of one (1) year, to find the attorney's fees and costs of \$331.65 as reasonable, necessary and actually incurred, and for the order to be effective immediately.

Motion: Jade Jacobo moved to revoke Certificate of Registration No. CS22331, with Respondent allowed to petition for reinstatement after a period of one (1) year from the effective date of the Order; to assess Respondent with attorney's fees and costs in the amount of \$331.65 as reasonable, necessary and actually incurred to be due within thirty (30) days of the order. The order is effective immediately.
