Crane Pomerantz, Esq., was present on behalf of Ivan Goldsmith.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Ivan Goldsmith alleging that Respondent Goldsmith failed to timely renew his Certificate of Registration No. CS33713 prior to issuing controlled substance prescriptions and failed to review patient utilization reports in the PMP database prior to issuing controlled substance prescriptions.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Ivan Goldsmith, Certificate of Registration No. CS33713, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS33713 is suspended for a period of two (2) years. The suspension is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by May 1, 2026; and 3) Respondent shall complete training from Board staff on use of the PMP database within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Order and shall complete follow-up training six (6) months after the initial training.

President Park disclosed that she was familiar with Nicole Sy, but she could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against First Choice Pharmacy, alleging that the Respondent, as pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Respondent purchased prescription drugs from pharmacies not licensed for wholesale distribution in Nevada.

The proposed stipulated penalties for First Choice Pharmacy, Pharmacy License No. PH04395, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2)

Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within 30 days of the entry date of this order.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Nicole Sy, alleging that, as managing pharmacist at the time of the events of January 2023 and October 2023, Respondent Sy purchased prescription drugs from pharmacies not licensed for wholesale distribution in Nevada.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Nicole Sy, Certificate of Registration No. 20646, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by July 1, 2026; and 3) Respondent shall complete two (2) additional CE hours on ethics and two (2) CE hours on duties of a managing pharmacist, in addition to the CE hours she must otherwise complete to maintain licensure, and shall provide certificates demonstrating completion of additional CE hours by July 1, 2026.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Kirk Beaulieu, alleging that, as managing pharmacist at the time of the events of December 2023 and April 2024, Respondent Beaulieu purchased prescription drugs from pharmacies not licensed for wholesale distribution in Nevada.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Kirk Beaulieu, Certificate of Registration No. 20184, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the Order; and 3) Respondent shall complete two (2) additional CE hours on ethics and two (2) CE hours on duties of a managing pharmacist, in addition to the CE hours she must otherwise complete to maintain licensure, and shall provide certificates demonstrating completion of additional CE hours by July 1, 2026.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Jill Allison Oliver, Certificate of Registration Nos. CS15479 and PD15479, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration Nos. CS15479 and PD15479 are suspended for a period of one (1) year. The suspension is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within 30 days of the order.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Thomas Umbach alleging that Respondent Umbach committed numerous violations related to controlled substances.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Thomas Umbach, Certificate of Registration Nos. CS16064 and PD00512, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. PD00512 is revoked, and Respondent cannot petition for reinstatement for a period of five (5) years from the effective date of the order. In the event Respondent applies for reinstatement of his certificate of registration, or applies for any other certificate, license or permit with the Board, he shall appear before the Board to answer questions and give testimony regarding his application. Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS16064 is suspended for a period of two (2) years. The suspension is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by April 3, 2026.

Ryan Clements and Brian Convery, Esq. (Representative for CVS Pharmacy #8822), were present.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against CVS Pharmacy #8822, alleging that, as pharmacy/pharmacy owners, CVS Pharmacy #8822 is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription that resulted in a negative patient outcome.

The proposed stipulated penalties for CVS Pharmacy #8822, Pharmacy License No. PH01145, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by April 30, 2026.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Ryan Clements alleging that Respondent Clements made an error in a prescription that resulted in a negative patient outcome.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Ryan Clements, Certificate of Registration No. 21841, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by April 30, 2026.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Grace Singson, alleging that, as managing pharmacist at the time of the events, Respondent Singson filled prescriptions that were not valid from October 22, 2025, to November 4, 2025.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Grace Singson, Certificate of Registration No. 24727, are the following: 1) public reprimand; 2) Respondent fined \$2,500 for the violations; 3) Respondent assessed \$750 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by September 4, 2026; and 4) Respondent shall participate in training with Board staff on laws related to controlled substances in Nevada within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this order.

Jade Jacobo returned to the meeting at 10:33AM.

Roger Morris, Esq. (Pro hac vice counsel for all Respondents), Todd Spears, Analeah Presbitero, and Jasmine Harshman (pharmaceutical technician) were present.

President Park disclosed that she was familiar with Analeah Presbitero, but she could participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Jade Jacobo recused herself from this matter to her previous employment with CVS.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Analeah Presbitero alleging that Respondent Presbitero made an error in a prescription while using virtual verification.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Analeah Presbitero, Certificate of Registration No. 23353, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$500 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the order.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Todd Spears alleging that Respondent Presbitero made an error in a prescription while using virtual verification.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Todd Spears, Certificate of Registration No. 18123, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of the order.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against CVS Pharmacy #6717, alleging that, as pharmacy/pharmacy owner, CVS Pharmacy #6717 is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription while using virtual verification.

The proposed stipulated penalties for CVS Pharmacy #6717, Pharmacy License No. PH01932, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by April 30, 2026; 3) On or before April 30, 2026, CVS corporate management shall provide the Board's staff with copies of written policies, procedures, training manuals or other materials, if any, that specifically confirm or corroborate its contention that all CVS pharmacists in Nevada have the discretion to perform visual inspections by physical or manual manipulation of prescription drug products before dispensing them to patients. If no such policies, procedures, training manuals or other materials exist, CVS management shall provide a written statement to that effect; and 4) On or before April 30, 2026, CVS corporate management shall provide a written statement or summary of its plan, if any, to provide ongoing periodic reminders to or conduct training with its pharmacists concerning their discretion to perform visual inspections by physical or manual manipulation of prescription drug products before dispensing them to patients. If no such plan exists, Respondent CVS shall provide a written statement to that effect.

C. Susan Nytes

(24-213-CS-S)

Susan Nytes was present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Susan Nytes alleging that Respondent Nytes failed to disclose prior Iowa Board of Nursing disciplinary action on her 2022 Nevada controlled substance application and failed to timely report to the Board the 2025 disciplinary action from the Nevada State Board of Nursing. She also issued at least 148 prescriptions between April 18, 2024, and June 11, 2024, without a valid Nevada DEA registration and without a registered practice location on file with the Board. Finally, she unlawfully accessed the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) database and subsequently disseminated the patient utilization report for a patient with whom she did not have a bona fide therapeutic relationship.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Susan Nytes, Certificate of Registration Nos. CS34530 and PR16791, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration Nos. CS34530 and PR16791 are revoked. Respondent may not possess (except pursuant to the lawful order of a practitioner), administer, prescribe or dispense a controlled substance or dangerous drug in Nevada until she has petitioned the Board for reinstatement. Respondent may not petition for reinstatement of her certificates of registration for a period of two (2) years from the effective date of this Order. If Respondent applies for reinstatement of her certificates of registration, or applies for any other certificate, license or permit with the Board, she shall appear before the Board to answer questions and give testimony regarding her application, her compliance with this Order, and the facts and circumstances underlying this matter. Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and Respondent assessed \$1,500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by March 4, 2027.

G. Festus Ebonka (25-215-CS-S)

Liborius Agwara, Esq., was present on behalf of Festus Ebonka.

Mr. Agwara requested that this matter be continued to a future Board meeting.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, informed the Board that Mr. Ebonka has not complied with the Order in Case No. 19-012-CS-S after his petition for judicial review was denied.

President Park stated that she would grant the requested continuance only once.

This matter will be continued to the next Board meeting on April 15, 2026, in Reno, NV.

E. Southwest DME (25-143-MP-S)

No one was present on behalf of Southwest DME.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against SouthwestDME alleging that Respondent failed to apply with the Board for a new license after the completion of the transaction which changed the controlling interest and not operate the business until the new owner was licensed by the Board. In addition, Respondent failed to notify the Board of the departure of its administrator within three business days and continued to operate as medical products provider for more than ten business days without an administrator being approved by the Board.

Mr. Kandt requested that the declarations of service by Board staff and the Memorandum of Attorney's Fees and Costs in the amount of \$1,240.92 be entered into the record.

Mr. Kandt requested the Board to make Findings of Fact consistent with paragraphs 1-5 of the Accusation.

Mr. Kandt requested the Board to revoke License No. MP03145. Respondent cannot petition for reinstatement for a period of two (2) years from the effective date of the order.
